- \* EXECUTIVE SESSION MAY BE HELD PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE (ORC) 121.22(G)(5), a public body may hold an executive session to consider "matters required to be kept confidential by federal law or regulations or state statutes."
- ORC 121.22(G)(6) provides that consideration of details relative to the security arrangements and emergency response protocols for a public body or a public office, "if disclosure of the matters discussed could reasonably be expected to jeopardize the security of the public body or a public office." Under this exception, both conditions must be met:
  - 1) The subject of the meeting must relate to the security arrangements and emergency response protocols for a public body or a public office; and
  - 2) Public disclosure of the matters discussed could reasonably be expected to jeopardize the security of that public body or public office.
