WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County received \$239,898,257 from the Federal Government through the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"); and

**WHEREAS**, Cuyahoga County calculated 100% of the ARPA dollars as loss revenue under the U.S. Department of the Treasury Final Rule; and

**WHEREAS**, since all the ARPA dollars have been calculated as loss revenue, the ARPA dollars have been deposited in the County's General Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Executive and County Council have authorized \$86 million of the ARPA dollars for community grants to benefit the residents of Cuyahoga County (the "ARPA Community Grant Fund"); and

**WHEREAS**, of the \$86 million for community grants, \$66 million have been encumbered for equal distribution to each County Council District; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding from the District 11 ARPA Community Grant Fund in the amount of \$25,000 to Community Housing Solutions for the Home Repair program; and

**WHEREAS**, Community Housing Solutions estimates approximately 6 people will be served annually through this award; and

**WHEREAS**, Community Housing Solutions estimates the total cost of the project is \$75,000; and

**WHEREAS**, Community Housing Solutions indicates the other funding source(s) for this project includes \$50,000 from the Federal Home Loan Bank of Cincinnati; and

**WHEREAS**, Community Housing Solutions is estimating the start date of the project will be July 2025 and the project will be completed by May 2026; and

- **WHEREAS**, Community Housing Solutions requested \$25,000 from the District 11 ARPA Community Grant Fund to complete this project; and
- WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding in the amount of \$25,000 to Community Housing Solutions to ensure this project is completed; and
- WHEREAS, this Council by a vote of at least eight (8) members determines that it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue to provide for the usually, daily operations of the County.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

- **SECTION 1.** That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby awards a not-to-exceed amount of \$25,000 to Community Housing Solutions from the General Fund made available by the American Rescue Plan Act revenue replacement provision for the Home Repair program.
- **SECTION 2.** If any specific appropriation is necessary to effectuate this agreement, the Director of the Office of Budget and Management is authorized to submit the requisite documentation to financial reporting to journalize the appropriation.
- **SECTION 3.** That the County Council staff is authorized to prepare all documents to effectuate said award.
- **SECTION 4.** That the County Executive is authorized to execute all necessary agreements and documents consistent with said award and this Resolution.
- **SECTION 5.** If requested or necessary, the Agency of the Inspector General or Department of Internal Audit is authorized to investigate, audit, or review any part of this award.
- **SECTION 6.** To the extent that any exemptions are necessary under the County Code and contracting procedures, they shall be deemed approved by the adoption of this Resolution.
- **SECTION 7.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga

County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

#### Home Repair

At Community Housing Solutions (CHS), we believe every home contributes to the strength of a neighborhood. That is why we help care for homes by providing repair assistance to those in need, creating safe, healthy and well-maintained homes in our community. CHS delivers person centered solutions that ensure homes remain a financial asset to homeowners and empower them to continue living in their homes even if they struggle to maintain their properties. The home repair program is for qualified and incomeeligible Cuyahoga County homeowners. The program addresses crucial repairs at no cost to low-income families, most often seniors, unable to afford expensive yet necessary repairs. The scope of work is customized for each client, and can include:

- Roofing and gutter work
- Heating, electrical and plumbing upgrades
- Interior and exterior carpentry work
- Security (new doors and window locks)
- Accessibility services for households with physically challenged members, including installation of ramps, removal of barriers, and modification of kitchens and bathrooms

#### Addressing the Following Needs:

The home repair program outcomes include:

- Addressing home repair assistance to low income homeowners so that they can live in a safe, healthy, and well-maintained environment.
- Ensuring that the homes of low-income families remain a financial asset to the owners as well as an asset in their communities.
- Empowering homeowners to continue living in their homes, rather than being forced to look for other housing because they are unable to maintain their properties.

This specific project will address critical repairs for residents in County Council District 11. These homeowners have been requesting service for these repairs for which funding is not available.

A Resolution amending Resolution No. R2025-0038, dated 2/11/2025, to provide for an Emergency Rental Assistance 2 Loan to Warner and Swasey, LLC, or their designee, in an amount not-to-exceed \$2,900,000.00 to authorize the use of the loan funds for the acquisition of real property, and costs directly related thereto, for the purpose of providing 112 affordable housing units at the former Warner and Swasey Manufacturing Plant, located in the City of Cleveland; authorizing the County Executive and/or Director of Housing and Community Development to execute all documents consistent with said loan and this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

WHEREAS, this Council approved Resolution No. R2025-0038, dated 2/11/2025, which authorized an Emergency Rental Assistance 2 Loan and Federal HOME Investment Partnership Loan to Warner and Swasey, LLC, or their designee, in an amount not-to-exceed \$3,350,000.00 for construction of 140 units for mixed-use, mixed-income, mixed-population, historic adaptive-reuse of the former Warner and Swasey Manufacturing Plant, located in the City of Cleveland; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Housing and Community Development, is now requesting to amend said Resolution to amend the terms of the loan as originally presented, to change the loan amount to \$2,900,000.00 funded solely from Emergency Rental Assistance 2 funds and to authorize the use of loan proceeds for the acquisition of certain real property, and costs directly related thereto, for the purpose of providing 112 affordable housing units at the former Warner and Swasey Manufacturing Plant, located in the City of Cleveland; and

WHEREAS, the primary goal of this loan is for construction of 112 units of affordable housing at the former Warner and Swasey Manufacturing Plant; and

**WHEREAS**, this is a forgivable loan based on compliance with affordability requirements for a term of 20 years; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That Section 1 of Resolution No. R2025-0038, passed February 11, 2025, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby authorizes an Emergency Rental Assistance 2 Loan and Federal HOME Investment Partnership loan to Warner and Swasey, LLC, or their designee, in an amount not-to-exceed \$2,900,000.00 \$3,350,000 for construction of the acquisition of certain real property, and costs directly related thereto, for the purpose of providing 112 affordable housing units for mixed use, mixed income, mixed population, historic adaptive reuse of at the former Warner and Swasey Manufacturing Plant, located in the City of Cleveland.

**SECTION 2.** That the County Executive and/or the Director of Housing and Community Development are authorized to execute all documents consistent with said loan and this Resolution. To the extent that any exemptions are necessary under the County Code and contracting procedures, they shall be deemed approved by the adoption of this Resolution.

**SECTION 3.** That this Resolution shall sunset twenty-four (24) months after County Council approval should the authorized action have not occurred by that date. In the event this Resolution sunsets prior to the authorized action taking place, the Director of Housing and Community Development shall notify the Clerk of Council in writing. The Clerk of Council shall record the sunsetting of this Resolution in the Council's journal.

**SECTION 4.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. WHEREAS, Chapter 714.02 of the Cuyahoga County Code establishes the County Community Development Supplemental Grant ("CDSG") Program and sets the Community Development Fund as the Program funding source; and

WHEREAS, the Community Development Supplemental Grant Program has been subject to a high demand and has received widespread interest and praise from the County's municipal corporations and townships; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to clarify and update the evaluation criteria for the Community Development Supplemental Grant Program in order to prioritize municipal corporations and townships.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** 714.02(E) of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended to read as follows (additions are underlined, deletions are stricken):

#### Section 714.02 County Community Development Supplemental Grant Program

(Paragraphs A-D remain in their entirety)

#### E. Evaluation Criteria

1. The Department shall issue written requirements for each year's application format, contents, and required attachments; and all documents required by the Department must be contained within the application or attached.

- 2. The Department shall establish and notify local communities of each year's application deadline and other requirements regarding the application deadline. All applications must be received by the deadline as set by the Department.
- 3. The Department shall evaluate applications based upon factors including, but not limited to, the following:
  - a. That the application meets the eligibility requirements specified in paragraph (D) of this section.
  - b. That the project specified in the application may complement or otherwise enhance other projects supported through other funding sources.
- 4. Each Community Development Supplemental Grant award shall not exceed \$50,000.00.
- 5. The Department shall prioritize applications received from municipal corporations and townships within Cuyahoga County in conducting its evaluation and making its recommendation to Council.

**SECTION 2**. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
