## **I. Call to Order / Roll Call**

Chairman O'Malley called the meeting of August 13, 2025 to order at 1:07 pm. Roll called, and a quorum was in attendance.

## **II. Approval of Minutes**

Motion to approve the meeting minutes of April 30, 2025; moved by Warren Griffin; seconded by Aaron Reese. All in favor, minutes approved.

## **IV. Old Business**

- Update by Lt. Devlin on CVD Dispatch Contract Transition. A new staff member, Randy Taylor was hired. The County has eleven trailers with ten in use. The trailers will be moved where needed.
- The County purchased a Chevy Colorado. It is being outfitted and should be in our possession within a week.
- LPR Transition-Most of the LPR's have been transitioned over to Houston Hida, except for the Jewish Federation cameras. We had not heard back from them within the week indicated. They expressed concerns about their cameras going to a federal database. Lt. Devlin spoke with Matt Maxwell from Leonardo, who stated that it's a federal database with the same concept that only law enforcement has a team retention period.
- Data Warehouse Update-What the County wants to do with the data from the Data Warehouse. Sharon Faenza from the IT Department, explained where we are right now, either to rebuild the system, which would be costly and time-consuming or decommission it. The biggest challenge is getting the codes from CVD for the County to operate the system. The contract between CVD and the County was clear that we own the codes.

## **V. New Business**

- The County is in the position to give Chagrin Valley our thirty-day notice to end the contract with them. They currently are paid \$480,000,000 a year by the County.
- Chairman O'Malley moved to terminate the contract in thirty days from CVD receiving a written notice from the County. All were in favor. The Prosecutor's Office will construct the letter.
- Update on the trailer's that are in use, decommissioned and get permission for equipment switches on trailer's.
- Chairman O'Malley suggested that Lt. Devlin speak at a future Chief's Association Meeting to inform them that three trailers are equipped with LPR's, and to remind them that when trailers are available, they can request their use.
- Assistant Prosecutor Warren Griffin, Deputy Chief Aaron Reese and Ryan Bocacci have been meeting with venders to get a solution to obtaining the information from the Data Warehouse. Assistant Prosecutor Griffin stated that the idea is to move from a Data Warehouse to an Information Center.
