- Update by Lt. Devlin; CVD was given a thirty day notice to sever contract (\$480,000 a year or \$40,000 a month). The County is still in the process of obtaining any hardware from CVD.

Update on the mobile trailer's; the County only received approval for two mobile trailer's and not five. Currently, the County has eleven trailers with one out of commission, and seven that are operable. The use of a trailer can now be done through an automated system, which will be routed to the Sheriff's Dept. A request The trailers will be moved where needed.
