BC2012-4 Department of Workforce Development

1. Description of Supplies or Services (If contract amendment, please identify contract term and/or scope change)

The Department of Workforce Development is requesting exemption from the Cuyahoga County Board of Control, Contracting and Purchasing Ordinance pertaining to the competitive bidding requirements. The exemption requested pertains to contracts with area employers for the provision of Customized Training contracts with area employers. The purpose of customized training is to support training projects that will benefit local business and industry by:

1) Assisting the skill development of EXISTING employees (Incumbent Workers), thereby increasing employee productivity and growth/retention of the company and its workforce; or

2) Providing a NEW employee with the skills needed to successfully perform their work.

Under Customized Training an Employer is reimbursed up to 50% of the total costs of training their workforce. Funds are made available to businesses that leads to one or more of the following:

1) Improve the occupational skills of the employers' workforce;

2) Assist employers in averting layoffs;

3) Help employees continue their skill building and maximizing their potential;

4) Raise the skill level of workers that leads to promotion;

4) Provide career progression that opens entry-level positions to others;

5) Increase retention in employment;

6) Increase individuals wages.

2. Estimated Dollar Value and Funding Source(s) including percentage breakdown

Approximately \$250,000 - \$500,000 annually funded by Federal Workforce Investment Act dollars.

3. Rationale Supporting the Use of the Selected Procurement Method

Workforce Development does use an open procurement process in contracting with area employers. To qualify for Customized Training, an employer submits an application to the Department outlining the training, the benefits to the employer and employee, and the project budget. A team of Department

staff review and approve the application. An employer can submit an application any time during the year as their needs for training materialize.
