work with local libraries to provide tutoring programs that support academic improvement.

Contract with Scenarios USA to assist in maintaining the countywide literature/screenwriting contest.

provide professional development services to funded and unfunded out-of-school time partners.

provide transition services that include supporting a child's transition into kindergarten and college access services.

2. Estimated Dollar Value and Funding Source(s) including percentage breakdown (If amendment, please enter original contracted amount and additional amount, if any)

For the first contract year from September 1, 2013 to September 30, 2014, for the amount not to exceed 1,600,000.00. Future funding will be determined based upon the budget.

3. Rationale Supporting the Use of the Selected Procurement Method (include state contract # or GSA contract # and expiration date)

Starting Point was selected because it is a State approved regional resource and referral agency. Starting Point completed an RFP with the State of Ohio and was awarded the contract for Northeast Ohio, covering early childhood and out-of-school time services for Cuyahoga, Geauga, Ashtabula, and Lake Counties.

4. What other available options and/or vendors were evaluated? If none, include the reasons why.

Starting Point is the agency designated by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) to serve as the child care and out-of-school time resource and referral agency in Cuyahoga County. They are a unique, neutral resource, suited to perform the functions of this contract as it is their mandate to serve all child care and out-of-school time entities in the county.

5. What ultimately led you to this product or service? Why was the recommended vendor selected?

In cooperation with philanthropic organizations, community leaders, residents, parents, and youth, "out-of-school time" was identified as a needed service in Cuyahoga County. Research showed that a third of Ohio's children ages 5 to 19 are in "self care" (no adult supervision) an average of 5.6 hours each week. The difference between a student's school week and their parents' work week can be as much as 25 hours. Kindergartners and school-age children left on their own may not be safe, and teens could make unhealthy choices that have lifelong consequences, and that may also affect others. A young person also is most likely to be the victim or perpetrator of a violent crime between the hours of 3 to 6 p.m., after school ends and before parents return home from work. Out-of-school time opportunities increase youth programming during these critical times, so that youth are in healthy, supervised environments. Starting Point was selected because it is the State-approved regional resource and referral agency for these services.

6. Provide an explanation of unacceptable delays in fulfilling the County's need that would be incurred if award was made through a competitive bid.

Delays in implementation of these components of the program would result in a lack of adequate training and technical assistance for providers who are currently serving children, jeopardizing their ability to adequately meet the needs of children with specific concerns. In addition, the system would be unable to respond to the need of parents who want their children in a safe environment after school and during summer break.

7. Describe what future plans, if any, the County can take to permit competition before any subsequent purchases of the required supplies or services.

The competition for these services happened on the state level with the issue of a regional contract. Using the agency designated by ODJFS to provide child care and out-of-school time resource and referral services allows Cuyahoga County to better use and coordinate services, and allows the County to maximize state funding that flows through the child care resource and referral system.

In 1996, Cuyahoga County applied for a Supportive Housing Program (SHP) grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on behalf of the Salvation Army for the "PASS Program", transitional housing for single men with supportive services.

The initial PASS program SHP award was for a three year term. After the initial three year term, the award has been renewed on annual basis. The annual renewal application is submitted by the Office of Homeless Services. Each Renewal Application is reviewed by the Review and Ranking Committee, a subcommittee of the OHS Advisory Board. There is a rigorous review process based on the vendor's performance outcomes, agency capacity and audit status, consumer satisfaction, and compliance with Continuum of Care HMIS requirements.

2. Estimated Dollar Value and Funding Source(s) including percentage breakdown (If amendment, please enter original contracted amount and additional amount, if any)

The contract amount is \$527,499.00. It is funded 100% by the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development.

3. Rationale Supporting the Use of the Selected Procurement Method (include state contract # or GSA contract # and expiration date)

The request is to exempt the agency from the RFP process because it was identified as the provider and the initial award was granted based on the agency being the Sponsor of the SHP program. Moreover, the annual review of the contract/provider/outcomes assures ongoing performance quality.

4. What other available options and/or vendors were evaluated? If none, include the reasons why.

At the time the grant was initially awarded, the Salvation Army had operated the PASS Program through a HUD Innovative Pilot Grant award. Salvation Army had demonstrated the capacity and ability to continue to operate the PASS program.

1. Description of Supplies or Services (If contract amendment, please identify contract time period and/or scope change)

Requesting an RFP Exemption as provided in Ord. No. 02011-0046, 3.03G. on behalf of EDEN, Inc.

In 2004, Cuyahoga County applied for and was awarded a Sponsor Based Shelter Plus Care (S+C) grants from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). S+C provides rent subsidies to homeless persons with long term disabilities. The community "matches "the rent dollars with in-kind behavioral health services.

The initial S+C grant application was a collaboration with the Mental Health Board, EDEN, and Cuyahoga County. Only Public Housing Authorities (PHAs) and Units of Local Government are eligible applicants under the S+C program regulations. The Mental Health Board requested that the County submit the application on account of this requirement. EDEN was identified in the 1993 application as the agency that would administer the rent subsidies because it was, and still is, the non profit housing arm of the ADAMHS Board.

The original S+C award was for a five year grant term. After the initial five year term, the award has been renewed on annual basis. The annual renewal application is submitted by the Office of Homeless Services. Each Renewal Application is reviewed by the Review and Ranking Committee, a subcommittee of the OHS Advisory Board. There is a rigorous review process based on determining the vendor's performance outcomes, agency capacity and audit status, consumer satisfaction, and compliance with Continuum of Care HMIS requirements.

2. Estimated Dollar Value and Funding Source(s) including percentage breakdown (If amendment, please enter original contracted amount and additional amount, if any)

The contract amount is \$1,383,696.00. It is funded 100% by the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development.

The request is to exempt the agency from the RFP process because it was identified as the provider and the initial award was granted based on EDEN being the implementer of the S+C program. Moreover, the annual review of the contract/provider/outcomes assures ongoing performance quality.

At the time the grant was initially awarded, EDEN had the expertise to manage the rent subsidy program. Since 1993, EDEN's capacity to perform this service has only expanded and deepened. Other than for the Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA) it is dubious that there would be any other vendor capable of implementing the program.

This contract provides RENEWAL funding for an ongoing rent subsidy program. To delay the contract would delay rent payments being paid to property owners renting to S+C recipients, which could jeopardize their housing stability.

The contract amount is \$371,928.00. It is funded 100% by the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development.

The request is to exempt the agency from the RFP process because it was identified as the provider and the initial award was granted based on EDEN being the implementer of the S+C program. Moreover, the annual review of the contract/provider/outcomes assures ongoing performance quality.

At the time the grant was initially awarded, EDEN had the expertise to manage the rent subsidy program. Since 1993, EDEN's capacity to perform this service has only expanded and deepened. Other than for the Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA) it is dubious that there would be any other vendor capable of implementing the program.
