B. Procurement

1. The procurement method for the acquisition of right-of-way for this project is that ODOT pre-qualified consultant O.R. Colan visits the property and prepares an appraisal, value finding, or value analysis [Fair Market Value Estimate "FMVE"] of the value of the property being acquired. These documents are then reviewed by an ODOT pre-qualified review appraiser [Emily Braman of Charles P. Braman & Co., Inc.]. Because the FMVE for this parcel exceeds \$500,000, ODOT required that a second ODOT pre-qualified review appraiser review the FMVE. The second review appraisal was completed by J. R. Bradford. Once the FMVE was finalized, O.R. Colan gave the property owner a copy of said document and negotiated with the property owner. In this case, the property's owner was in bankruptcy and during the course of that bankruptcy, ownership changed hands. This Agreement is with the new, current owner of the property.

The reasons for the excess amount are that both the previous owner and the current owner believe that the per sq. ft. value placed on the property is too low. The sq. ft. values of comparable properties contained in the FMVE ranged from a low of \$9.39 per sq. ft. to \$13.77 per sq/ ft.

Initially, the settlement demand was for \$712,000. After negotiations, the owner is willing to settle for \$700,000.00, which is reached by using a value of \$12.75 per sq. ft.

Settling for this amount is reasonable as it uses a value per sq. ft. that is within the range of values contained within the FMVE. Additionally, if we were to appropriate this property instead of settling, the cost of litigation, which would necessarily include an updated appraisal, expert depositions and trial testimony and similar fees, would approach, if not exceed, \$15,000, not including attorney time, plus there would be the attendant risk of a jury verdict in excess of \$700,000. It should be further noted that R2013-0149, adopted July 23, 2013, authorized the appropriation of this property from its previous owner, Cleveland I Limited Partnership. Negotiations continued throughout this process, and this administrative settlement was reached after the adoption of R2013-0149.

We believe that given all of the attendant circumstances, this administrative settlement is reasonable. It has been approved by Ohio Department of Transportation, District 12's Real Estate Administrator Daniel Dougherty and is eligible for reimbursement.
