## **AGENDA ITEMS**

## 1. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL / QUORUM DETERMINATION

- Roll Call, 15 voting members, Quorum established

## 2. PUBLIC COMMENT

 Lt. Crates made public comment that all Westshore agencies should be considered a regional request for MARCS radios. A high speed pursuit occurred last night and departments were not able

to communicate. The requests of individual departments should be rolled into one request. Chief Gallagher from North Olmsted made his plea for radios. 102 total radios requested with 54 available.

- Chief Flynn noted 261 total radios requested with 54 currently available. Money in the future maybe variable but it is based on what hasn't been spent (around \$2,000) and what might come out of the 6 million available State wide, local allotments is unsure. The Westshore region needs radios and are able to go live within the 4 month MOU window. Westlake and Fairview have already received 10 radios each.
- Steven Greene made a motion that the Westshore agencies be allowed to combine their requests into one request. Second by Chief Gilman. Further Discussion Brad Handke noted that all Cleveland Police Officers have been issued radios and an off duty was able to summon assistance. Vote taken, 13 yes, 2 abstained

## 3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

 October 9th and November 13th meeting minutes. Motioned by Chief Turner. To accept, second by Chief Freeman. Minutes for October meeting voted on, 9 Yes, 6 Abstained. Minutes for November 13th meeting voted on, 7 Yes, 8 Abstained. Both passed.

#### 4. CONTINGENCY PLAN

• It is the intention of this committee to report to the CCESAB that if monies become available, our intention is to use the money to purchase additional radios to complete the requests made beyond the 54 radios currently available. Motion made that our contingency plan is to purchase additional P25 radios with monies as they become available. Randy Kimbro made the motion, Steve Greene seconded the motion. Further discussion involved Steve Garwood noting that many other model radios are available on State term. Motion voted on 12 yes, 2 abstained, 1 no vote.

#### 5. SHARED TEMPLATE WITH LAKE COUNTY

Paul Stafanko requested a talk group from Cuyahoga County for interoperability. Cleveland has 16 available for free for anyone who asks for them. MTACs are limited to Cuyahoga County only. CUYCO are available to be shared. NPSPAC channels should be in all radios in order to have medical flight Communications. Steve Garwood requests a code plug in order to add the talk groups to the Lake County radios.

## 6. HOMELAND SECURITY REGION 2 MEETING

• Tammy Blau gave an update. Lorain County was the only county not represented. CKR Numbers are a concern and coordination would be needed so that interoperability is not hindered. Data still being collected of digital devices and radios.

### 7. REALLOCATION UPDATE

- Westshore agencies now score a 30 putting them at the top of the list. Hazmat and Water Rescue are specialty teams and have requested radios which would be used for their response. The question is, are they within the requirement of daily use when in reality the radios would only be used for a call out in a mutual aide usage. Motion made Steve Greene Recognizing the importance of specialty teams in response to emergencies throughout the region and then priority response to terrorism incidents, the Communications Committee recommends that said teams be permitted to reprioritize their equipment requests for money already allocated to purchase radio equipment. Chief Gilman seconded the motion. 15 yes, no abstained.
- Motion made by Steve Greene that specialty teams should be defined as daily use. Seconded by Lisa Raffurty. Vote 1 yes, 1 Abstained, 13 no. Motion did not pass therefore specialty teams are not recognized by this committee as daily use.
- Private entity discussion brought up that County legal needs to provide an opinion if this committee is allowed to share public monies with private entities. Eastcom's request is being asked by Lisa Raffurty to be placed at the bottom of the list for consideration. Their request was based on a big IF they assume police dispatching and the radios were not for immediate use. Steve Greene made a motion to accept Cleveland Heights as amended to be for 30 radios for the police department only. Second by Chief Elliot. 12 yes, 3 abstained.
- The order of ranking of applications: Westshore -102 radios, ranked 30 points Bratenahl police - 15 radios, ranked 22 points Brooklyn police - 54 radios, ranked 21 points

Gates Mills - 3 radios, ranked 20 points Eastcom -30 radios, ranked 20 points Pepper Pike - 9 radios, ranked 18 points

- A motion was made by Carol Haddon to approve the list as read, seconded by Chief Gilman. 13 yes,
  2 abstained
- To allow for rapid and efficient deployment and training so as to facilitate interoperability the Communications Committee recommends to the County that the same radios be distributed as before to the agencies whose requests have been accepted by the Communications Committee. Vote 13 yes, 2 abstained.
- Chief Turner made a motion that all 54 radios be allocated to the Westshore group as they ranked the highest. Second by Steve Greene. Vote 13 yes, 2 abstained.

#### 8. ANNOUNCEMENTS

- Per Jim Jarvis: Tech service branch of DHS/OEC working on a state version of the NIFOG. State SCIP to be voted on January 29th. CASAM updated to provide bordering state assets. Cleveland Communications Interoperability Capabilities Updated Assessment Grid looking to be updated. To be emailed out by Pete Greene to all members for updated information.
- MARCS monthly testing has issues that need to be addressed. To be placed on the agenda for next month.
