This includes fiscal and programmatic reporting, contract execution, monitoring of grant related activities, tracking expenditures for compliance and communication with our State VAWA point of Contact. Funding initiatives under the VAWA grant occur annually in the following manner and as per grant guidelines:

- **The Ohio State Office of Criminal Justice Services issues a notification of block funding to the Regional Planning Unit counties (Cuyahoga, Franklin and Hamilton).
- **Department of Public Safety and Justice Services (grant administrator) issues/advertises a solicitation for applications under the grant guidelines.
- **Applications are scored and recommended for funding by the VAWA Allocation Committee.
- **Recommended funding is submitted to the Executive for approval.
- **Applications are sent to the State for final approval and award.
- **The County Receives a Notice of Award for the grant.
- ** The County enters into Contracts/ Agreements with awarded vendors/agencies.

**Projects run from January 1 through December 31 on a yearly basis.
