I. Call to Order / Roll Call

Chief Timothy Malley called the meeting of September 21, 2016 to order. Roll called and a quorum was in attendance.

II. Approval of Minutes

IV. New Business - REDSS Manager Report

Prioleau Green and Barbara Giffen discussed LEAD disconnections and follow-up with remaining customers on ending services.

Pri Green noted 30 agencies currently have Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) units, although all units are not active, he is contacting those agencies to discern the reasons.

Brandy Carney discussed reasons for inactivity which included end of life hardware, the need for updated software and administration of the system. Chief Malley noted equipment and operation of the system is not as effective as it could be with some agencies, denoting the lack of reception from the law enforcement community. Discussion on fixed versus mobile ALPR's, costs for the agencies and future funding,

V. Announcements/Other Business

Brandy Carney commented on the REDSS budget moving forward with LEADS services disconnection. County Dept. of Information Technology (DoIT) services are being reviewed, as well as other options to receive those services more cost effectively.

It was noted at the beginning of the year REDSS will only provide ALPR, Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and InJail services. City of Cleveland is open to sharing RMS data with regard to a data warehouse.

With regard to ALPR moving forward there will be no user fee for 2017. AFIS will be handled by the County Medical Examiner's Office. AFIS is currently on the REDSS network but will soon to migrate to the County's DoIT servers. InJail system services are offered. Discussion on InJail system capabilities and interfacing.

With no further business Andy Nichol moved to adjourn; Chief Foster seconded; meeting adjourned.
