II - REVIEW MINUTES - 2/26/2018

Armond Budish motioned to approve the minutes from the February 26, 2018 meeting, as written; Dale Miller seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Armond Budish referred to BC2018-147 and stated that it was his understanding that the County is contemplating filing a lawsuit with the Judges. Mr. Budish asked Martin Murphy who represents the Corrections Planning Board, if he had any additional information as it relates to the disparity in the allocation of funding between Counties statewide; and asked about the timeline to apply for TCAP Program grant funds. Dale Miller asked for clarification that if it becomes mandatory for Felony 5 (F5) offenders who meet the TCAP criteria to remain in Cuyahoga County and not be allowed to transfer to the State penitentiary, effective July 1, 2018, why does the grant period reflect 5/1/2018 - 6/30/2019. Mr. Miller also asked if F5 is considered to be the lowest type of offender.

After further discussion, Mr. Budish recommended item BC2018-147 be held for a week as he would like to consult with Judge John J. Russo and the Law Department as to whether approving this item would impact the County's ability to file a lawsuit.

Public safety departments have personnel training and exercising for response to potential terrorist events involving hazardous materials.

Office of Homeless Services requesting approval of a Contract with Metanoia Project, Inc. for the amount of \$25,000.00 to provide emergency shelter for homeless single adults who are shelter resistant; 1/01/2018 through 5/31/2018.

The Metanoia Project coordinates street services to homeless persons on an annual basis, with the weekend shelter services offered only during the months of November through April.

The Metanoia Project, Inc. provides shelter on the weekends and when the temperatures go below 20 degrees. The persons served are those who are "shelter resistant" - that is, not willing to access the emergency shelter at 2100 Lakeside or 2227 Payne Avenue. This service provides an emergency shelter option during the coldest weather, for people who might stay outside otherwise. This service helps to prevent people with severe mental health and drug and alcohol issues from freezing to death on the street. Metanoia Project began this service 5 years ago. The Men's and Women's Shelter are open to

anyone who seeks shelter, but there are some individuals who do not trust a shelter operated by a recognized entity. Metanoia Project, Inc. is a grass roots, faith based inspired response to an observed need. There are no other entities that attempt to provide this nighttime service to this very vulnerable and disabled population. The Metanoia Project uses space provided by St. Malachi Church located at W. 25th and Detroit Avenue.

Contract start date is January 1. The 2018 budget was not approved until 1/19/18, preventing contracts with 1/01/start dates from being submitted.

The Court of Appeals ran out of room/office space for its new Staff Attorney. This would give him a secure and confidential work space that the Law Library could still use for storage. Giving the Court of Appeals space in its storage room will provide an office for the Court's new Staff Attorney. Otherwise, he would have to do all of his work at the front desk of the Court of Appeals, which is not a proper place to work on confidential Court business. The Court of Appeals is desperate for space.
