I. Call to Order / Roll Call

Chairman O'Malley called the meeting of July 10, 2020 to order. Roll called, quorum in attendance.

II. Approval of Minutes

Motion to approve the meeting minutes of January 29, 2020; Prosecutor O'Malley moved; seconded by Brandy Carney; all in favor, minutes approved

IV. Old Business



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- Sgt. Devlin spoke with Cpt. Vogel of Westlake and sent new MOU.
- There was a call out to Acting Chief Cpt. Lessisck of Beachwood regarding their MOU.
- Signed up ONIC (Ohio Narc Intelligence Center) Bob Fiatal. The Intelligence Center had no data to share.
- On June 29, 2020, Sgt. Devlin spoke with Larry Jones from the City of Cleveland for an update, and Larry Jones was going to check with Dep. Chief Pretel on status of their MOU.
- City of Cleveland Command Central received agreement contract from Selex. The contract was forwarded to Executives office for legal review.

V. New Business

- The Lumen Project is waiting for Board of Control approval.
- The Central Square (Lakewood RMS) stated they will not commence the project until the end of 2012, They wanted \$130,000 to make connection, 100% up front and other projects will take priority. Sgt. Devlin recommended having 3rd party (CVD) make connection to Lakewood's data.
- On July 15, 2020, there was a meeting with Jill Smialek (witness/victim) and Erin Becker (high risk DV courts) regarding the TPO project with the Data Warehouse. The great amount of requests from outside agencies to join the Data Warehouse was discussed, as well as a proposed MOU with a \$1,000 a year maintenance agreement. Would start with agencies that use TAC or Sundance first.
- License Plate readers were discussed regarding the second round of Urban Area Initiative and the \$850,000 Grant. There are 4 vendors who have provided bids. Letter of Intent were sent to Leonardo (Elsag). This would entail the addition of 103 cameras. Parma purchased 4 cameras which are now online. Mayfield Heights is moving 3 cameras and purchasing 8 more. The Jewish Federation is looking to purchase 17 to 20 cameras. By the end of the year there should be approximately 220 fixed and 46 mobile cameras. It was also discussed that there would be a need to increase the server space.



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- Mobile Camera Trailers are in need of repairs and the cost of the repairs were discussed. Also the mobile camera trailers were deployed for the protests at the 1st District, 2nd District, Beachwood, and Fairview Park.
