II – REVIEW MINUTES – 4/11/2022

Michael Chambers motioned to approve the minutes from the April 11, 2022 meeting; Leigh Tucker seconded. The minutes were approved by unanimous vote, as written.

III – PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

B. - New Items for Review

BC2022-230

Department of Public Works, submitting Agreement No. 2398 among Board of Park Commissioners of the Cleveland Metropolitan Park District and Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.00 for sewer maintenance services and disposal of wastewater sewer grit, commencing upon agreement signature of all parties for a period of 1 year.

Funding Source: Revenue Generating

Nichole English, Department of Public Works, presented. There were no questions. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2022-230 was approved by unanimous vote.

Department of Public Works and Department of Sustainability, submitting an amendment to Contract No. 857 with AEP OnSite Partners, LLC for the purchase of electricity generated by Rooftop Solar System installed at various County facilities in connection with the Aggregated Solar Project for the period 6/1/2019 - 5/31/2029, to extend the time period to 12/31/2031, to change the scope of services to increase the size of the array system at the Harvard Road Garage, effective 5/1/2022 and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$121,950.13.

Funding Source: The project is funded by the vendor. The vendor purchases and maintains the panels, then sells the power back to the County at the agreed upon rate.

Valerie Katz, Department of Sustainability, presented. Nan Baker asked for clarification on the project's return on investment and what were the savings in energy costs over the past 2 years; asked if the \$280,0000.00 in savings over the next 10 years will result from the solar panels already installed at 4 separate locations; asked for clarification on the funding source and whether project costs are covered by the vendor; and asked if the energy purchased over the 10-year period will result in cost savings. James Boyle commended the Department of Sustainability and Department of Public Works on their collaborative efforts and forward thinking to achieve project goals. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; Dale Miller seconded. Item BC2022-231 was approved by unanimous vote.

Department of Public Works, submitting an amendment to Contract No. 1113 with The Vallejo Company for the replacement of Green Road Bridge No. 07.47 adjacent to Euclid Creek and resurfacing of surrounding roadway in the City of South Euclid for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$137,434.34.

Nichole English, Department of Public Works, presented. There were no questions. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2022-232 was approved by unanimous vote.

Paul Porter and Shaunquitta Walker, Department of Purchasing, on behalf of the County Treasurer's Office, presented. Nan Baker asked how the funding amount being requested was determined; and asked if the encumbrance of \$5,000.00 per year for Department of Internal Audit will be tracked. Dale Miller asked if the County pays bank fees for these services; asked why Key Bank National Association provides Procurement Card services when they do not make money; and asked for clarification if vendor makes money from other services under the umbrella of this contract without making money directly related to Procurement Card services. James Boyle asked how the Department of Internal Audit managed prior expenditures that would now be covered under the Procurement Card Program; and asked the Law Department if there are any contractual issues related to non-executive agencies use of this program and if there are any others that participate, such as the County Planning Commission, that needs to be reviewed. Jerad Zibritosky, Department of Law, said that this specific issue has not been reviewed. Mr. Porter indicated he would follow up with the list of Procurement Card users by department. Michael Chambers commented that the Department of Internal Audit will not use all the approved funding; said that the amount for Department of Internal Audit was questioned after the item went through the Infor approval process and was agreed that only \$5,000.00 would be encumbered per year for travel related expenses; said that \$3 billion flows through the property tax system and that Key Bank makes money in other banking service areas; and said that the Procurement Card is helpful to employees for travel related expenses, which in many cases, does not get reimbursed until after the travel has occurred. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2022-233 was approved by unanimous vote.

Narrative

The CY2022 Calendar Year Contract between the Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Service Board of Cuyahoga County (ADAMHS Board) and Common Pleas Court Corrections Planning Board/TASC is a continuation of previous grant agreements which were called Calendar Year Contract in 2020 and Non-Medicaid Agreement between the Board and Common Pleas Court Corrections Planning Board TASC prior to that time. This agreement and the CY2019, CY2020 and CY2021 agreements included grant funding for three separate grant and Accounting Units and Activity Codes. For CY2021 they were: Treatment Capacity Expansion (CP320125 - CP-21-TCE), Adult Treatment Drug Court (CP320125 - CP-21-ATDC), and CCCC Women's Reentry IOP (CP320120 – CP-21-JIOP). In all years, the ATDC grant operated as a fee for service grant with no limit on the total dollar amount. The TCE grant was always fee for service but had a dollar limit on the total amount of funding. Since January 2019, the total dollar limit was eliminated. The ADAMHS Board has approximately \$12 million in a pooled funding arrangement with all providers offering SUD treatment services, via which these two grants participate. The CCCC Women's reentry IOP is a pilot program for females in the jail to attend Intensive Outpatient Treatment prior to their release with a fixed dollar amount for services. In 2022, the total grant amount is again \$100,000 to be spent on salaries and benefits for a portion of two IOP Counselors and/or a portion a supervisor's salary and benefits and miscellaneous supplies to be used for the program.

Similar to the previous agreements, services provided under these grants are for clients not eligible for Medicaid funding due to being incarcerated or otherwise ineligible for Medicaid funding. Estimated revenue to be derived from the combination of TCE and ATDC is \$200,000 based on prior year actual fees earned and the anticipated increase in services as Covid restrictions are lessened.

Expenses related to the fee for service grants includes salaries and benefits, office supplies, client incentives, bus tickets and training/conference costs.

Title: Department of Public Safety & Justice Services; FY2020 - FY2022; U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA); Grant Agreement; FY20 DNA Capacity Enhancement for Backlog Reduction (CEBR) Program (Formula) Grant — Correct Award Period Dates.

Scope of Work Summary:

The purpose of this submittal for Board of Control consideration is to clarify the Award's period of performance beginning and ending dates which are 10/1/2020 and 9/30/2022, respectively. Historically, the Medical Examiner's Office has been an annual award recipient of the federally funded DNA Capacity Enhancement for Backlog Reduction (CEBR) Program (Formula) Grant. Through the 2019 Award period, the DNA Backlog Awards were administered by the National Institute of Justice (NIJ). Beginning with the FY20 Awards, federal administration was changed to the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA). Additionally, all DNA Backlog Award documents, management and administration activities were pushed-out under a new federal BJA grants management platform on October 15, 2020, however, award recipient access was delayed into the 1st quarter of 2021 further impacting grant award access to deliverable and administrative activities. Prior to the FY20 Awards the federally designated DNA Backlog Awards historically commenced on January 1st for a 24 month period of performance duration, ending on December 31st. Beginning with the FY20 DNA Capacity Enhancement for Backlog Reduction (CEBR)

Program (Formula) Grant Award, the 24 month period of performance dates changed to an October 1st commencement and a September 30th ending, respectively, even though award recipient funding access was not available until after January 1, 2021.

Although this Award received BOC approval under Consent Item Approval No. CON2020-59, the Award's end date was incorrectly depicted as December 31, 2022 in the attached Consent Item Approval of September 28, 2020. For additional reference, as attached, and depicted in the original Briefing Memo submittal under Consent Item Approval No. CON2020-59, the commencement and end dates were correctly depicted as October 1, 2020 and September 30, 2022, respectively. It appears the discrepancy may have occurred based on the historical references to the pre-FY20 commencement and end dates, the change to the new federal grant management platform and unavailable access to the award until after 01/01/2021, as well as, the initial OnBase platform entry that incorrectly depicted the Award's performance period from 01/01/2021 to 12/31/2022.

Pursuant to Consent Item Approval No. CON2020-59, the correct Award performance period is 10/01/2020 to 09/30/2022 with all other matters unchanged as attached and approved.

Title: Department of Public Safety & Justice Services; FY2022; Ohio Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS), American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Crime Lab Backlog Grant Project - Application and Acceptance of Grant Award Funding.

Scope of Work Summary:

The Cuyahoga County Department of Public Safety & Justice Services (PSJS) received a request to submit an application under the "American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Crime Lab Backlog Grant" for funding consideration on March 28, 2022 from the Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS). PSJS submitted an application on behalf of the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office Regional Forensic Science Laboratory (CCRFSL) by the April 1, 2022 due date for evaluation and consideration to receive up to \$1,000,000 in grant award funding with no local cash match requirement.

At the onset of the coronavirus in 2020, the laboratory suffered the effects of the nationwide lockdown to reduce contamination spread which included stay-at-home orders and a reduction in onsite staff numbers at the CCRFSL. This had the immediate impact of disrupting workflows and operational communications, resulting in disjointed analytical testing, data review and production of evidentiary validations. Subsequent impact also included significant delays to planned method development, causing strategic methods for increased efficiency to fall and remain behind schedule. As the CCRFSL continues to experience casework backlogs caused by the pandemic, acceptance of award funding will provide for more timely processing of evidentiary analyses used and required by law enforcement in criminal investigations and prosecutorial court proceedings.

Under this notice to receive ARPA funding, the application must demonstrate how the pandemic negatively impacted the CCRFSL community and how the proposed response will mitigate that negative impact. Justified use of Award funds must address crime lab testing backlogs that were either caused by or made worse by the pandemic with Award allocations used for: Additional staff or staff hours, New technology, and/or Technical assistance and training on laboratory efficiency to reduce backlogged casework.

The CCRFSL application submitted for award consideration includes select laboratory procurement expenses, some of which will be "sole-source" within the following budget categories: "Personnel" and "Fringe Benefits" for Overtime, "Equipment" for instrumentation, "Supplies" for ballistic analyses and "Other" costs for new technology, licensing and software platform improvements.

The primary goals of the project are:

The primary goals and purpose of this ARPA funding is to address the negative impacts of the coronavirus pandemic and how the pandemic negatively impacted the community with the primary goal submitted through the CCRFSL's proposed application response to mitigate that negative impact.

As required and pursuant to award acceptance and commencement upon grant agreement execution, the procurement method for this project is through acceptance of grant award funds in the amount up to \$1,000,000 through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) administered by the Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS). The proposed grant funded procurement activities, some of which will be "sole-sourced" include: "Personnel" and "Fringe Benefits" for Overtime, "Equipment" for instrumentation, "Supplies" for ballistic analyses and "Other" costs for new technology, licensing and software platform improvements.

Contractor and Project Information

The grant funds will be used for selected "Personnel" and "Fringe Benefits" for Overtime, "Equipment" for instrumentation, "Supplies" for ballistic analyses and "Other" costs for new technology, licensing and software platform improvements.

Project Status and Planning

Based on award receipt and upon full contract execution the project's retroactive commencement is February 1, 2022 and will continue for a 24 month period ending on January 31, 2024 with an additional time allocation of up to 90 days to complete any mandatory grant close-out requirements. This is a new grant project and there is no prior approvals or history.

Funding

The project is 100% grant funded. The schedule of payments received by the County is through quarterly reimbursement requests submitted to the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS).
