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

The 2024 Community Development Supplemental Grant (CDSG) Competitive Grant process began August 25, 2023, with an informational instructional meeting, and the release of applications, all applications were due back to the Department of Housing and Community Development by November 28, 2023. This was a competitive grant process as required by Council Legislation and County Code. A total of \$1.5M per year of Community Development funds (Casino) is allocated, from County Council to this program, with 3% paid to the Department of Housing and Community Development for administrative costs, thus leaving \$1,688,828.00 to award to grantees. A total of 42 applications - 34 communities and 8 non-profits - were received for funding consideration in the amount of \$2,037,471.00:
