1. CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chairman Sweeney called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Mr. Sweeney asked Clerk Richardson to call the roll. Committee members Sweeney, Casselberry, Houser and Schleper were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Chairwoman Conwell was absent.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

Loh addressed the Committee regarding the ongoing construction of the Women's Homeless Shelter located at 2227 Payne Avenue.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE MAY 6, 2026 MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Casselberry, seconded by Mr. Schleper and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes from the May 6, 2026 meeting.

A motion was made by Mr. Sweeney, seconded by Mr. Schleper and approved by unanimous vote to excuse Chairwoman Yvonne Conwell from the meeting.

5. MATTERS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

- a) R2026-0140: A Resolution authorizing an amendment to Contract No. 6178 (fka Contract Nos. 5836, 3272 and 2730) with Emerald Development and Economic Network, Inc. for Rapid Re-housing and housing stabilization services for the period 1/1/2022 – 12/31/2025 to extend the time period to 12/31/2027, to amend terms, and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,842,300.00, effective upon contract signatures of all parties; authorizing the County Executive to execute the amendment and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Ms. LeVine Ross, Director of the Office of Homeless Services addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2026-0140. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Sweeney asked questions of Ms. Ross pertaining to the item, which she answered accordingly.

Mr. Houser thanked Emerald Development and Economic Network, Inc. for all of their work and advocacy.

On a motion by Mr. Casselberry with a second by Mr. Schleper, Resolution No. R2026-0140 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

- b) R2026-0141: A Resolution making an award on RQ16099 to The MetroHealth System in the amount not-to-exceed \$3,100,000.00 for comprehensive medical services for children and families involved with the Division of Children and Family Services for the period 1/1/2026-12/31/2027; authorizing the County Executive to execute the Contract No. 5732 and all other documents consistent with said award and this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. Marcos Cortes, Administrator of the Division of Contracts and Performance for the Department of Health and Human Services, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2026-0141. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Sweeney asked questions of Mr. Cortes pertaining to the item, which he answered accordingly.

On a motion by Mr. Casselberry with a second by Mr. Schleper, Resolution No. R2026-0141 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

- c) R2026-0148: A Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$50,000, to the Cleveland Urban Minority Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Outreach Project ("Cleveland UMADAOP") for the renovation and rehabilitation of the Central Intake and Outpatient Services Facility House from the District 7 ARPA Community Grant Fund; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. Ronnie Davis, Executive Director of Cleveland UMADAOP, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2026-0148. Discussion ensued.

On a motion by Mr. Casselberry with a second by Mr. Schleper, Resolution No. R2026-0148 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda for second reading.

- d) R2026-0151: A Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$10,000, to the Cuyahoga County Division of Senior and Adult Services for the Cuyahoga County Senior Resources Access Hub from the District 10 ARPA Community Grant Fund; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Ms. Natasha Pietrocola, Director of the Division of Senior and Adult Services, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2026-0151. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Schleper thanked Ms. Pietrocola and her team for the work they're doing to address the needs and barriers the Senior community faces when attempting to navigate through Government systems to access critical resources.

Mr. Schleper also thanked Committee member Houser for pledging the funding for the Cuyahoga County Senior Resources Access Hub Initiative.

Mr. Houser echoed Mr. Schleper's comments and stated that if we can make it easier for Seniors to access the resources that have already been paid for through their tax dollars we are happy to do our part.

Mr. Casselberry thanked Ms. Pietrocola for the work she is doing and said that he appreciated the presentation she gave and will do whatever he can to help support this Program.

On a motion by Mr. Casselberry with a second by Mr. Houser, Resolution No. R2026-0151 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda for second reading.

Committee members Schleper, Houser, Casselberry and Sweeney requested to have their names added as co-sponsors to the legislation.

- e) R2026-0153: A Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$10,000, to the Crimson Heights Ministries as fiscal agent for Strategic Resources Consulting, LLC for the Freedom Summer 2026 Project from the District 8 ARPA Community Grant Fund; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. Trevor McAleer, Legislative Budget Advisor presented a proposed substitute to change the fiscal agent name from Crimson Heights Ministries to Cleveland Clergy Coalition Incorporated, and asked if the Committee would consider adopting the proposed substitute.

A motion was made by Mr. Houser, seconded by Mr. Schleper and approved by unanimous vote to accept the proposed substitute.

Pastor Aaron Phillips, Executive Director of the Cleveland Clergy Coalition and Mr. Kenn Dowell, Owner of Strategic Resources Consulting and the Strategic Moves Media Network, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2026-0153. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Pastor Phillips and Mr. Dowell, pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

Mr. Sweeney requested to add funds in the amount of \$5,000.00 from the District 3 ARPA Community Grant Fund which will be incorporated into a proposed substitute for consideration at the next Council meeting for second reading.

On a motion by Mr. Sweeney with a second by Mr. Casselberry, Resolution No. R2026-0153 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda for second reading, as substituted.

Committee members Schleper, Houser, Casselberry and Sweeney requested to have their names added as co-sponsors to the legislation.

- f) R2026-0157: A Resolution authorizing an amendment to Contract No. 5898 (fka Contract No. 4944) to Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry for joint transition and rapid housing project services in connection with the Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program for the period 1/1/2024-12/31/2025 to extend the time period to 12/31/2026, to amend and replace various terms, and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,676,083.00, effective 1/1/2026; authorizing the County Executive to execute the amendment and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Ms. LeVine Ross, Director of the Office of Homeless Services and Ms. Maria Foschia, President and Chief Executive Officer of Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2026-0157. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Ms. Ross and Ms. Foschia pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Mr. Casselberry with a second by Mr. Schleper, Resolution No. R2026-0157 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

6. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

Resolution No. R2026-0165

Sponsored by: Councilmember Conwell	A Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$7,230, to the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center for the Growing Community Awareness of Sexual Violence Project from the District 7 ARPA Community Grant Fund; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.
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WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County received \$239,898,257 from the Federal Government through the American Rescue Plan Act (“ARPA”); and

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County calculated 100% of the ARPA dollars as loss revenue under the U.S. Department of the Treasury Final Rule; and

WHEREAS, since all the ARPA dollars have been calculated as loss revenue, the ARPA dollars have been deposited in the County’s General Fund; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive and County Council have authorized \$86 million of the ARPA dollars for community grants to benefit the residents of Cuyahoga County (the “ARPA Community Grant Fund”); and

WHEREAS, of the \$86 million for community grants, \$66 million have been encumbered for equal distribution to each County Council District; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding from the District 7 ARPA Community Grant Fund in the amount of \$7,230 to the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center for the Growing Community Awareness of Sexual Violence Project; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center estimates approximately 15,003 people will be served annually through this award; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center estimates the total cost of the project is \$15,000; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center is estimating the start date of the project will be June 2026 and the project will be completed by October 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center requested \$15,000 from the District 7 ARPA Community Grant Fund to complete this project; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding in the amount of \$7,230 to the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center to ensure this project is completed; and

WHEREAS, this Council by a vote of at least eight (8) members determines that it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue to provide for the usually, daily operations of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby awards a not-to-exceed amount of \$7,230 to the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center from the General Fund made available by the American Rescue Plan Act revenue replacement provision for the Growing Community Awareness of Sexual Violence Project.

SECTION 2. If any specific appropriation is necessary to effectuate this agreement, the Director of the Office of Budget and Management is authorized to submit the requisite documentation to financial reporting to journalize the appropriation.

SECTION 3. That the County Council staff is authorized to prepare all documents to effectuate said award.

SECTION 4. That the County Executive is authorized to execute all necessary agreements and documents consistent with said award and this Resolution.

SECTION 5. If requested or necessary, the Agency of the Inspector General or Department of Internal Audit is authorized to investigate, audit, or review any part of this award.

SECTION 6. To the extent that any exemptions are necessary under the County Code and contracting procedures, they shall be deemed approved by the adoption of this Resolution.

SECTION 7. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga

County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 8. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
