The recent election for this seat was one of the closest in county history, decided by just 245 votes out of over 62,000 cast. ## **Animal Shelter Expansion Project**

Our Cuyahoga County Animal Shelter in District 6 community Valley View just celebrated a ribbon cutting for its first-ever expansion. This \$2.7 million investment transforms the shelter, enhancing services and programming, while providing a safe and loving environment for our furry friends.

The expansion includes space for indoor playgroups, training and meetings, new signage, new fencing and gates, and new artificial turf for outdoor dog play areas.

Our Animal Shelter serves as a model to other communities, and I am grateful to District 11 Councilwoman Sunny Simon's \$50,000 ARPA contribution to this important project.

### **Property Tax Assistance Program**



As property taxes have increased, this has become an added burden on many homeowners in Cuyahoga County. The County's new Taxpayer Assistance Program can provide up to \$10,000 in one-time direct assistance to qualified County taxpayers aged 70 or older with an active delinquency. In addition to direct assistance, the program will fund housing counseling services to help ensure residents are given tools they need to catch up on their taxes and make informed housing choices going forward.
