Q2 - 2024 Accomplishments:

Cuyahoga County received \$239,898,257 from the federal government through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). Cuyahoga County calculated 100% of the ARPA dollars as loss revenue under the U.S. Department of Treasury's Final Rule and deposited it into the County's General Fund. The County Executive and County Council have authorized \$86 million of the ARPA dollars for community grants to benefit the residents of Cuyahoga County, known as the ARPA Community Grant Fund. \$66 million was evenly distributed to the 11 Council Districts. Since funds were allocated, District 9 has approved \$5.2 million in American Rescue Plan Act dollars to benefit District 9 and other Cuyahoga County projects that are beneficial to our Cuyahoga County community. These include:

Sexennial reappraisal

Under Ohio State law and Department of Taxation rules, real property is reappraised every six years by state licensed appraisers. An appraisal is a professional opinion/estimate of value. Property values are updated based on market estimates, neighborhood sales and new construction, and proposed values per square foot. An increase in valuation does not mean your property taxes will increase. Residents should have already received their property value notices, and tax bills will become available in December.




Residents who wish to contest their valuation can file a complaint with the Board of Revision by visiting cuyahogacounty.gov/bor.

There are some options for lessening property taxes or make it easier to pay property taxes:

- Homestead Exemption Program: a statewide program that reduces the property tax burden of qualified senior citizens and permanent and totally disabled homeowners, disabled veterans and surviving spouses of public service officers killed in the line of duty, by exempting some of the market value of their home from taxation. You can request an application at https://www.homestead@cuyahogacounty.us or by calling 216-443-7050, prompt 1.
- Owner Occupancy Tax Credit: A real estate tax reduction of 2.5% available to a homeowner for their principal place of residence. If you do not see this credit applied to your bill, contact the County at OOC@cuyahogacounty.us or call 216-443-7050, prompt 2.
- **EasyPay:** Homeowners wishing to pay their future property taxes in monthly or semi-annual installments rather than one lump sum can take advantage of EasyPay, a free service allowing for auto pay for property taxes. The form is available at **cuyahogacounty.gov/treasury.**
- Active Military Property Tax Deferral: Allows National Guard Members and Military Reservists to defer the property taxes until six months after termination of active duty, in the event that they are deployed. The form is available at

I know that this is a stressful and important issue for homeowners. Unfortunately, the property reappraisal process is mandated by state law. County Council has no ability to alter or cap property taxes. Only the Ohio legislature has the ability to do that. **If you would like to reach out to your representative, you can find out who represents you and get their contact information by visiting legislature.ohio.gov.**


Back to School!

Ohio's Sales Tax Holiday

Every year, the State of Ohio has a sales tax holiday of at least three days if a budget surplus exists. This year, Ohio's sales tax holiday is from 12:00 a.m. Tuesday, July 30th until 11:59 p.m. Thursday, August 8th (that's 10 days!). This year's tax holiday period includes more eligible items that before, and offers much higher price limits on items that will not be taxed, up to \$500 (when it used to be only \$75!). The holiday also covers internet sales if the retailer accepts the order during the exemption period. The only exceptions are alcoholic beverages, marijuana products, motor vehicles, services normally subject to sales tax, tobacco and vapor products, and watercraft or outboard motors that must be titled.



The sales tax holiday is a great way to provide help to Cuyahoga County families, especially during school shopping and while the cost of living is still rising. I encourage you to take full advantage of the holiday and support local when you can! Learn more at ohio.gov.
