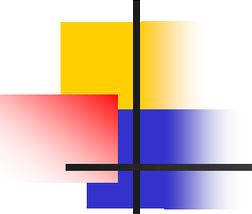

- Mission

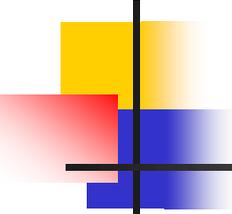
- To provide quality in-home and community-based services to seniors, disabled, and vulnerable adults based on individual need



Senior & Adult Services

Benefits & Services Division

- **Community Social Services Program**
 - Goal is to eliminate isolation and reduce loneliness for seniors and disabled adults.
 - Services Offered: Adult Day, Adult Development, Comm. Impaired Services, Congregate Meals, Homemaking, Transportation
- **Information & Outreach**
 - Connecting seniors and disabled adults with benefits/services to provide greater economic security and independent living
 - Benefits Checkup
 - Web-based screening for a vast array of public benefits
 - Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)
 - Assist senior/disabled adults with application completion, verification and submission
 - Community Presentations/Event
 - Presentation and distribution of information pertaining to DSAS and other available resources/services
- **Community Resources**
 - Rapid response to assess clients in their home or safe location and other interventions or care planning.
- **Medicaid Benefits (transferring to E.F.S.- 07/03/11)**
 - Staff determine eligibility for Medicaid Benefits for:
 - **Nursing Home**
 - Short-term and long-term institutionalizations
 - **Waiver Programs**
 - PASSPORT, PACE, Ohio Home Care Waiver, Assisted Living Waiver, MRDD/CCBDD



Senior & Adult Services

Program Division

- **Adult Protective Services**

- Staff investigates allegations of abuse, neglect, self-neglect and/or exploitation of residents 60+ and Disabled/vulnerable adults 18+

- **Home Support**

- Home Support serves clients that other agencies will not accept, many of which are due to complex social issues and unpleasant living environments.
 - We are the only home care provider for the Ryan White program and the only direct service provider for the National MS society.
 - Many of our clients have current or past APS involvement.
 - Home Support Nurses collaborate with APS to achieve the best possible outcomes for the clients. They do an average of 6 joint visits a month. The home health aides are also utilized to provide emergency care to clients in crisis.

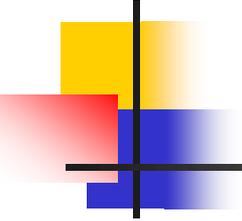
- **Options**

- The Options Program serves frail residents 60+ who are not eligible for PASSPORT or other Medicaid waiver programs due to income or asset levels
- Services provided with no or minimal co-pays based on income/asset level

State Budget Impacts- 2011

- **Direct Financial Reductions for CY2011**
 - State and Federal funds
 - \$115,581
 - HHS Levy Impact
 - \$203,402
 - TOTAL reduction
 - \$318,983 (1.4% of current budget)

 - None

Critical Issues

- Data Management Consolidation
 - No centralized client management system
 - 17 separate systems currently in place
 - Inefficient, data duplication, reporting issues

- Staffing Levels
 - Reduced client services
 - Reduced revenue

- System Collaboration
 - Leveraging of other resources to fill service gaps
