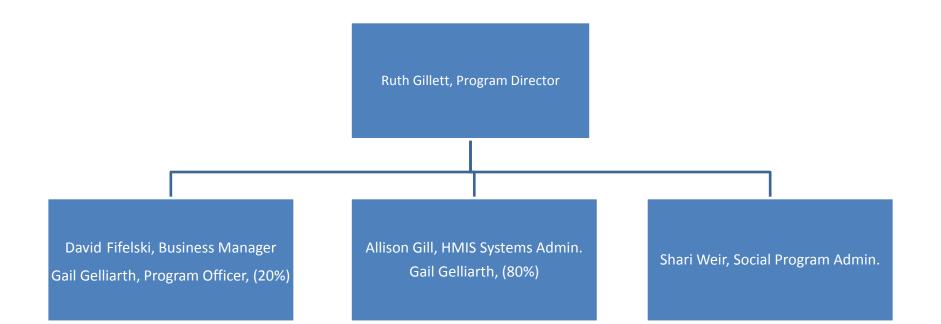
#### Objectives

Identify long term strategies to reduce homelessness and increase affordable housing Manage community compliance with the congressionally mandated Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)

Continue support to meet the goal of developing 1,000 units of Permanent Supportive Housing for Chronically Homeless Persons by 2015 Increase coordination between mainstream systems (ADAMHS Board, DCFS, EFS, WIA) and the homeless continuum

# *Critical Issues for OHS for Next 18 months*

- Complete "Strategic Utilization of CoC Resources (SURE) Project ~ analysis of resources and needs; align information with strategy to reduce length of stay /divert persons from entering shelter; include clearly stated goals and measurable objectives
- Implement "Coordinated Intake" within the shelter, transitional housing, and permanent housing systems
- Utilize HMIS information for data driven evaluation, accountability, and system change
