

Performance Last Year

- 9 Federal performing measures: Exceeded 7, met 2
- 3,639 Adults placed in jobs
 - 60% African American
 - Average age 39
 - ✤ 15% (545) ex-offenders
 - 27% (983) public assistance
 - ✤ 11.8% (429) age 55 or over
- 478 Adults trained under WIA
- > 98 enrolled in County Education Assistance Program
- > 1,777 Youth served (1,047 in Youth Resource Center) ages 14-21
 - 77% African American
 - 96% low income
 - 57% public assistance
 - 76% placed in employment or higher education
 - 64% GED or HSD
 - 58% literacy or numeracy levels increased

Performance Last Year: Business Services

- Conducted 339 targeted job recruitments
- Assisted in 4,798 jobs posted
- Made 15,745 job seeker referrals
- > 4,487 interviews for job seekers by 1,665 hiring employers
- Processed 53 Workforce Development Agreements (WDAs) through County and City Economic Development Departments: 669 placements made of which 403 are minorities (CY 2014)
