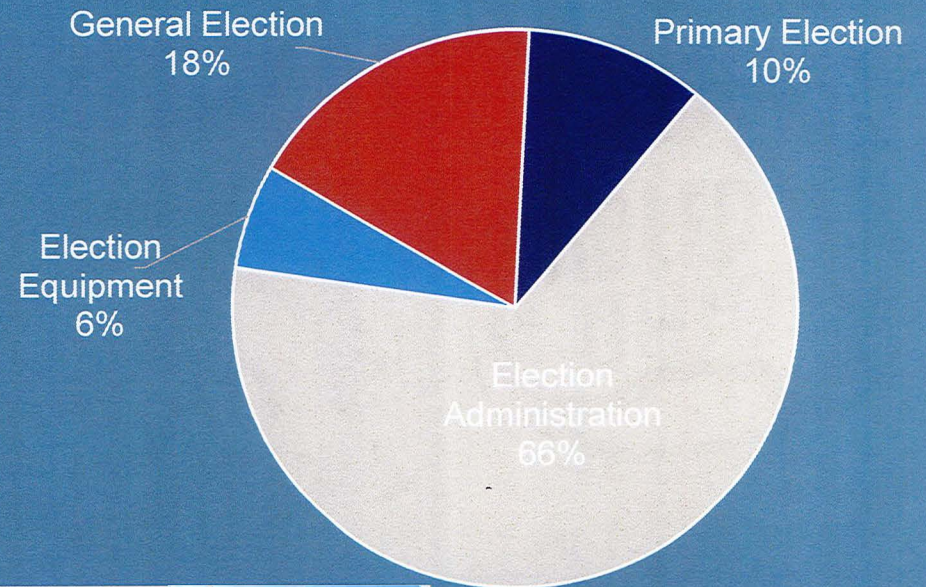
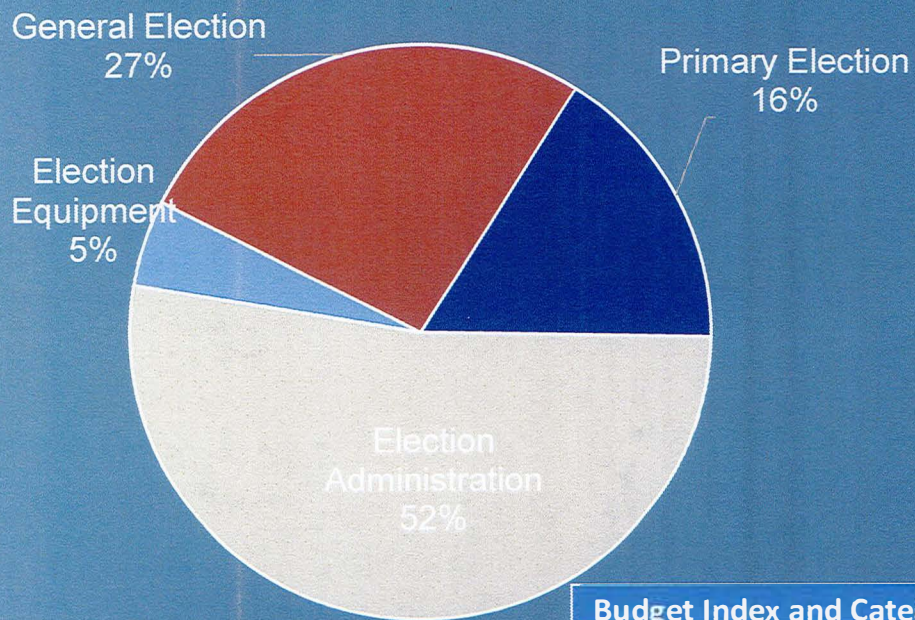

# Voting Tabulation Equipment Acquisition

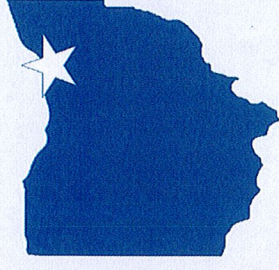
## Funding Restrictions

- Allowable Expenditures: initial purchase and installation of voting system hardware and software
- Additional training, required ancillary items, and additional costs associated with operating, servicing, maintaining, and insuring the voting system

## Cuyahoga County – Anticipated Timeline

- Rollout of new system in the May 2021 Primary Election
- Continue evaluation process through the end 2020
  - Additional funding needs for ineligible expenses necessary to complete the implementation unknown until final tabulation selected
- Final recommendation presented to County Council for approval by the end of 2020
  - Any additional appropriations for expenses not covered by the state funds will be requested at this time

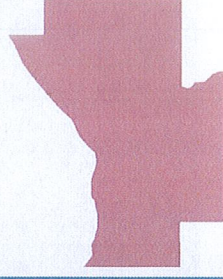

# EARLY IN-PERSON (EIP) VOTING | CONSTRUCTION

New legislation changes the method in which Boards conduct Early In-Person Voting

## PROS

- ✔ Mirrors the Election Day Voting Experience at the Polls
- ✔ Eliminates the Ballot Application and ID Envelope
- ✔ Less Paperwork to Manage
- ✔ Faster Check-in Time
- ✔ Voters Insert Ballots Directly Into Scanners
- ✔ ID Envelope Opening No Longer Required
- ✔ Second Chance Voting

## CONS

- ✘ Increased Space Requirements in
  - Anticipate **45,000** Early In-Person Voters to cast ballots at BOE during November 2020 Presidential Election
    - 2016 = 38,413
  - Previously processed EIP Voters on 2 Floors to accommodate Voters
  - Partnering with the Department of Public Works on the feasibility of repurposing current space
    - Vote-by-Mail Processing Center move from BOE to open space at the Halle Warehouse
    - Modify the 1st floor at BOE utilizing space created by moving Vote-by-Mail Process
