The Office of Budget & Management requests that the members of County Council consider the attached fiscal resolution for approval on first reading at the meeting on **January 23, 2018**. The requested fiscal items, including additional appropriations, appropriation transfers, and cash transfers, are necessary to cover expenses.

This agenda includes the following requests:

- An increase in appropriation in the Department of Public Works to cover a consulting contract for the Justice Center project. This contract was discussed with Council during the Public Safety Committee meeting on January 16<sup>th</sup>. This contract is being supported by General Fund reserves and does not impact the ability of the County to maintain a reserve greater than or equal to 25% of total expenditures.
- An increase in appropriation to the ERP budget to support an amendment to a contract for temporary staffing services, bringing the total cost of the contract to \$236,774. This increase is supported by the General Fund and does not represent an increase to the overall \$25 million budget for the development and implementation of the ERP.
- An appropriation and cash transfer request to close out an expired Information Technology project that will return \$274,806.41 to the County's General Fund.
- Requests to transfer budgeted subsidies to the HHS Division of Homeless Services, Juvenile Court, and the Soil and Water Conservation District. These subsidies were excluded from the first agenda of the year due to a staff absence in OBM.
- Request to transfer \$1.75 million from the Development Revolving Loan Fund to the General Fund, as planned in the 2018 Budget (please see page 2 of the Cover Memo submitted with the final 2018-2019 Biennial Budget). The second half of the \$3.5 million budgeted transfer will be requested at midyear.
- Request to fund the expenses incurred for active capital projects through December 2017. Active capital projects are funded on a monthly basis as expenses are incurred.
