All non-essential travel by County employees has been restricted. He indicated that the situation is fluid and that he will regularly update Council.

The 2019 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funded competitive Municipal Grant process began August 20, 2019 with the release of applications due to the Department of Development by December 6, 2019 by 4:30 pm. At the end of the day on December 6th the following 25 communities submitted applications for consideration in a total amount of \$3,442,373.00:

This was a competitive process as is required by the Cooperation Agreement which is signed by communities in Cuyahoga County that wish to participate in CDBG funded programming. The review committee consisted of representatives from the Department of Development (3), Public Works, Planning Commission, County Executive Staff, and CSU College of Urban Affairs. The team reviewed all 25 of the applications submitted.

This year only we are funding beyond the amount usually allocated for these awards. A review of past spending in connection with our new 2020-2025 five year HUD planning cycle showed an accumulation of unused Community Development Block Grant allocations. There is danger of losing future HUD funding if past year funds are not spent in a timely manner. By awarding more we ensure we meet the funding spenddown test, as required by HUD, by November 1, 2020. This high level of awards will not be possible in future years.

After reviewing each application thoroughly, the committee assigned scores supporting our recommendation the following communities receive 2019 municipal grant funding for projects and activities to be done in 2020:

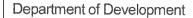
SECTION 2. That the County Executive is authorized to execute agreements and contracts in connection with said awards and all other documents consistent with this Resolution.

The following information is submitted for your review and approval:

The 2020 CDSG competitive Grant process began October 1, 2019 with the release of the 2020 application and instructions.

An information session was held back on May 29th, 2019 with potential applicants to provide a mini workshop on what makes a successful application and to go over the requirements of the 2020 CDSG application and the CDBG Muni Grant application, in detail.

42 applications were returned to the Department of Development by the due date of January 3, 2020 by 4:30pm. At the end of the day 32 communities and 10 non-profits submitted applications for consideration in a total amount of \$2,009,508.50

Applications were categorized into the following groups for review purposes:

- 12 Parks and Gardens
- 7 Community/Senior Center
- 7 Streetscape
- 5 Infrastructure
- 5 Miscellaneous
- 4 Signage
- 2 Exterior Maintenance

This was a competitive process with the review committee consisting of representatives from the Department of Development, County Council, County Planning Commission, County Department of Public Works and Cleveland State University College of Urban Affairs.

Currently the available funding for 2020 is \$1,615,704 which includes funds carried forward from the 2018 grant. The proposed funding recommendation is in the total amount of \$1,595,364. The Review committee further recommends a grant in the amount of \$15,000 to Cultural Gardens to support their One World Day activities.

The CDSG review team thoroughly reviewed all 42 of the eligible applications submitted and recommends the following for funding:

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is rapidly spreading, as members of the community have been infected with the disease and the risk of serious illness is imminent. The resulting impact of the disease on Cuyahoga County residents and businesses is potentially catastrophic; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the spread of COVID-19, Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish declared a State of Emergency within Cuyahoga County on March 11, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County is committed to the health and well-being of its employees and their families; and

WHEREAS, the life, safety, and welfare of residents of Cuyahoga County are in jeopardy due to the outbreak of the Coronavirus disease (COVID 19); and County Executive Budish has issued a Declaration of a State of Emergency for Cuyahoga County; and,

WHEREAS, due to the emergency conditions detailed in the Declaration of a State of Emergency for Cuyahoga County, the need for flexibility and speed in entering contracts or leases or make necessary purchases, it has become necessary to amend the terms of the County's Emergency Contracting Authority; and

WHEREAS, the amendments to the County's Emergency Contracting Authority are necessary to protect the life, safety, and welfare of the County's citizens

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. Section 501.08 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended as follows (additions are marked in bold and underline):

Section 501.08 Emergency Contracting Authority

- A. In an emergency which threatens the life, health, or property in the County, as declared and determined by the County Executive, and in which official action is needed prior to when a meeting of the County Council or the Board of Control could take place:
 - 1. the County Executive, <u>or their designee</u>, is authorized to <u>may</u> enter into contracts or leases or make purchases not to exceed \$500,000.00 for any one emergency event, without obtaining the approval of the County Council or the Board of Control;
 - 2. the County Executive, or their designee, is authorized to enter into contracts or leases or make purchases in excess of \$500,000.00 for any one emergency event, without obtaining the approval of the County Council or the Board of Control, provided same is otherwise approved by the President of Council, or their designee.

Whenever this power is exercised, the County Executive shall immediately <u>or as soon</u> <u>as practicable</u>, send a report to County Council and post the report on the county's website, describing the nature of the emergency, the actions taken, and the estimated cost and sources of funding for the actions taken.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County is committed to the health and well-being of its employees and their families; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the employees of Cuyahoga County that they be encouraged to remain at home and out of the workplace when they have an illness especially during this period of emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Executive and the Cuyahoga County Council have determined that in order to keep Cuyahoga County employees and their families safe and healthy each employee who has exhausted his or her accrued sick leave shall receive eighty (80) hours of paid emergency administrative leave; and

WHEREAS, the eighty (80) hours of paid emergency administrative leave shall be retroactively effective as of March 11, 2020, and shall expire December 19, 2020; and

WHEREAS, this Uncodified Ordinance shall apply to any and all employees currently employed by Cuyahoga County or any employee hired by Cuyahoga County during this period of emergency; and

WHEREAS, this Uncodified Ordinance authorizes the County Executive or his designee to provide additional paid emergency administrative leave on an individual basis; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive or his designee shall adopt rules and regulations regarding the authorization of additional paid emergency administrative leave; and

WHEREAS, if additional paid emergency administrative leave is approved by the County Executive or his designee, the usage of such time shall be recorded by the Department of Human Resources and on a monthly basis the Director of the Department of Human Resources shall provide a written report to Council on the additional paid emergency administrative leave authorized; and

WHEREAS, the period during which the County Executive or his designee can approve any additional paid emergency administrative leave shall expire on December 19, 2020; and

WHEREAS, all other provisions contained in the Cuyahoga County Employee Handbook regarding call-off procedures, return-to-work procedures, and required documentation are still in effect and shall be complied with by any County employee under this Uncodified Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, policies applicable to bargaining employees shall be effective as permitted under state law and the Collective Bargaining Agreements. For bargaining unit employees, the terms and conditions regarding call-off procedures, return-to-work procedures, permissible and prohibited uses of sick leave and required documentation set forth in the collective bargaining agreements shall supersede and govern; and

WHEREAS, if County employees are ordered to stay home, the County Executive shall implement paid leave with the approval of the Council President; such policy shall expire on December 19, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. Adoption of Uncodified Ordinance. Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish declared a state of emergency within Cuyahoga County on March 11, 2020. Because of this declaration, Council hereby authorizes the County Executive to provide all County employees eighty (80) hours of paid emergency administrative leave after the employee has exhausted his or her existing accrued sick leave. All employees currently employed by the County and any employee hired by the County during the

period of emergency declared by the County Executive shall receive this paid emergency administrative leave benefit. This paid emergency administrative policy is effective March 11, 2020 and shall be in effect until the emergency no longer exists, such time to be determined by the Cuyahoga County Health Commissioner, pursuant to the declaration of emergency issued by the County Executive. Paid emergency administrative leave time expires December 19, 2020. If an employee should exhaust his or her paid sick leave and paid emergency administrative leave then additional paid emergency administrative leave may be granted, on an individual basis, at the discretion of the County Executive or his designee; the County Executive is authorized to adopt rules and regulations regarding the authorization of additional paid emergency administrative leave. If additional paid emergency administrative leave is approved by the County Executive or his designee, the usage of such time shall be recorded by the Director of the Department of Human Resources. The Director of the Department of Human Resources shall provide a written report on a monthly basis to Council on the additional paid emergency administrative leave granted. The period during which the County Executive or his designee can approve additional paid emergency administrative leave shall expire on December 19, 2020. Paid emergency administrative leave is not subject to pay out.

- **SECTION 2**. Council hereby authorizes the County Executive or his designee to temporarily expand the use of paid sick leave as authorized in Section 11.03 of the Cuyahoga County Employee Handbook. Such authorization shall expire on December 19, 2020.
- **SECTION 3**. Council hereby authorizes the County Executive or his designee to temporarily expand the use of unpaid personal leave of absence as authorized in Section 11.06 of the Cuyahoga County Employee Handbook. Such authorization shall expire on December 19, 2020.
- **SECTION 4**. All provisions contained in the Cuyahoga County Employee Handbook regarding call-off procedures, return-to-work procedures, and required documentation are still in effect and shall be complied with by any County employee granted leave under this Uncodified Ordinance.
- **SECTION 5.** Policies applicable to bargaining employees shall be effective as permitted under state law and the Collective Bargaining Agreements. For bargaining unit employees, the terms and conditions regarding call-off procedures, return-to-work procedures, permissible and prohibited uses of sick leave and required documentation set forth in the collective bargaining agreements shall supersede and govern.
- **SECTION 6**. If County employees are ordered to stay home, the County Executive shall implement paid leave with the approval of the Council President, for the period ending December 19, 2020.
