1. CALL TO ORDER

Council President Brady called the meeting to order at 2:03 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Council President Brady asked Deputy Clerk Carter to call the roll. Councilmembers Baker, Miller, Tuma, Gallagher, Conwell, Jones, Brown, Stephens and Brady were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Councilmembers Schron and Simon entered the meeting after the roll-call was taken.

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

4. SILENT MEDITATION

Council President Brady asked for a moment of silent meditation be dedicated to the people that Council has pledged to serve during this difficult time.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments given.

- 6. APPROVAL OF MINUTES
  - a) March 10, 2020 Committee of the Whole Meeting
  - b) March 10, 2020 Regular Meeting

A motion was made by Mr. Miller, seconded by Ms. Brown and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes from the March 10, 2020 Committee of the Whole and Regular meetings.

#### 7. ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Council President Brady stated that the purpose of the Special Meeting was to consider legislation that would allow for flexibility for emergency spending and additional administrative leave for employees during this health crisis. Council President Brady also announced that the March 24th Council meeting would be canceled and discouraged any upcoming Committee meetings. Council will not be out of session, but Councilmembers will be communicating remotely with each other, staff and the administration. He also commended Governor DeWine for his leadership and encouraged everyone to watch the daily press conferences and updates from the Department of Health.

#### 8. MESSAGES FROM THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

County Executive Budish reported that the County is working to manage the current health crisis. He noted that we will all need to make sacrificies, but those sacrifices will save lives. The County is managing the crisis with a team that includes the County Board of Public Health, Emergency Management, State and City Departments of Health, emergency service providers, courts and Prosecutor's office. There has also been enhanced custodial services to sanitize buildings. He thanked Governor DeWine for his leadership and announced that a countywide emergency was declared last week. County Executive Budish also announced that he submitted legislation to facilitate the process of making emergency purchases as well as legislation that would grant 80 hours of administrative sick leave for employees. He encouraged sick employees to stay home and is working with department directors to identify employees who may be able to work from home. He also thanked Council for their assistance in helping to manage this pandemic.

# FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, OHIO AND CITY OF BEREA, OHIO

This FOURTH AMENDMENT ("Amendment") made this date upon which this Amendment is fully executed by both parties ("Effective Date") by and between the County of Cuyahoga, Ohio, a body corporate and politic and a political subdivision of the State of Ohio organized and existing under the Charter of Cuyahoga County effective January 1, 2010, as same may have been amended, modified, and supplemented to the effective date hereof, (the "COUNTY"), on behalf of the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "CCDPW"), and the City of Berea (hereinafter referred to as "CITY"), a municipal corporation of the State of Ohio, pursuant to the authority of Ordinance No. 2020-12 passed by Berea City Council on March 23, 2020.

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and CITY entered into a sanitary and storm sewer maintenance agreement for the period June 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 for an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, on or about July 17, 2018 the parties entered into a First Amendment to extend the term of the Agreement to December 31, 2018 and increase the contract amount by \$300,000.00; and

WHEREAS, on or about January 8, 2019 the parties entered into a Second Amendment to extend the term of the Agreement to March 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, on or about March 26, 2019 the parties entered into a Third Amendment to extend the term of the Agreement to March 31, 2020 and increase the contract amount by \$110,000.00;

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into a Fourth Amendment to extend the term of the Agreement to March 31, 2021 and increase the contract amount by \$1,600,000.00.

WHEREAS, the parties agree to the terms and conditions indicated herein below.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises and obligations herein to be observed and performed by the parties hereto, the parties hereby agree as follows:

#### I. INCORPORATION

- A. The original Agreement, together with the amendments, are herein collectively referred to as the "Agreement." The foregoing recitals are incorporated in the Agreement as if fully rewritten herein.
- B. The provisions of this Amendment are incorporated into the original Agreement, as if fully rewritten in the Agreement. All terms used in this Amendment shall be defined and construed in the manner set forth in the original Agreement. Except as otherwise provided in, or as otherwise necessary or appropriate to give effect to the terms of this Amendment, all the provisions, terms, and conditions contained in the Contract and not inconsistent with this Amendment shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect. In the event of any conflict between the original Agreement and this Amendment, the terms, the conditions and provisions of this Amendment shall control.

#### II. TERM

The term of the Agreement is extended from April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021, unless otherwise canceled or terminated under the terms of the Agreement. The Effective Date of this Amendment is the date this Amendment has been duly executed by the County Executive or his duly authorized designee.

#### III. COMPENSATION

The contract amount is hereby increased by \$1,600,000.00.





WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 crisis, this Council passed uncodified Ordinance No. O2020-0007 which provided for up to 80 hours of paid emergency administrative leave to every County employee who has exhausted his or her existing accrued sick leave; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary to delete the requirement that accrued sick leave be exhausted prior to the employee accessing the paid emergency administrative leave; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this uncodified Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That Section 1 of uncodified Ordinance No. O2020-0007 is hereby amended to read as follows (deletions are stricken, additions are bolded and underlined):

Section 1. Adoption of Uncodified Ordinance. Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish declared a state of emergency within Cuyahoga County on March 11, 2020. Because of this declaration, Council hereby authorizes the County Executive to provide all County employees eighty (80) hours of paid emergency administrative leave after the employee has exhausted his or her existing accrued sick leave. All employees currently employed by the County and any employee hired by the County during the period of emergency declared by the County Executive shall receive this

paid emergency administrative leave benefit. This paid emergency administrative policyleave benefit is effective March 11, 2020 and shall be in effect until the emergency no longer exists, such time to be determined by the Cuyahoga County Health Commissioner, pursuant to the declaration of emergency issued by the County Executive. Paid emergency administrative leave time expires December 19, 2020. If an employee should exhaust his or her paid sick leave and paid emergency administrative leave then additional paid emergency administrative leave may be granted, on an individual basis, at the discretion of the County Executive or his designee; the County Executive is authorized to adopt rules and regulations regarding the authorization of additional paid emergency administrative leave. If additional paid emergency administrative leave is approved by the County Executive or his designee, the usage of such time shall be recorded by the Director of the Department of Human Resources. The Director of the Department of Human Resources shall provide a written report on a monthly basis to Council on the additional paid emergency administrative leave granted. The period during which the County Executive or his designee can approve additional paid emergency administrative leave shall expire on December 19, 2020. Paid emergency administrative leave is not subject to pay out.

**SECTION 2**. That all other provisions of uncodified Ordinance No. O2020-0007 not amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 3.** It is necessary that this uncodified Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County and the reasons set forth in the preamble.
