WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Re-Subscribing to ReadyNotify

You may have received a text or email asking you to re-register for ReadyNotify, the County's emergency notification system that sends out messages concerning emergencies, weather events and community news. ReadyNotify has been upgraded to a new platform called CodeRED, and as part of this transition, you must re-subscribe if you did not re-register by the March 15th deadline.

Re-subscribing ensures that the system has accurate contact information and enables added functionality and features of the upgraded system, including targeted weather alerts for home, work or travel, safety alerts, or other emergency notifications and community specific updates.

You can re-subscribe at readynotify.us. It should only take a few minutes.

Construction and Maintenance Notices

<u>Towpath Trail, Stage 1 in the City of Cleveland</u>: Work will continue along Harvard Road and Jennings Road. Traffic will be maintained in each direction.

<u>Towpath Trail, Stage 3 in the City of Cleveland</u>: Work will resume in spring when weather permits. Landscaping needs to be performed and will have minimal impact to traffic.

<u>Wallings in the City of Broadview Heights</u>: When weather permits, the asphalt surface course will be paved on Wallings Road between I-77 and the east corporation limit, traffic will be maintained with flaggers during paving operations. This will take a couple of days and will probably be performed in May.

<u>Royalton Road in the City of North Royalton</u>: Current work will continue on Royalton Road. Current traffic patterns will remain the same for the next few months.

<u>Future Amazon Site Perimeter Roads in the City of Euclid</u>: Limited single lane closures along Babbitt Road, Lakeland Blvd, St. Clair Ave, E. 260 Street as intersection and sidewalk paving operations continue.

<u>Stone Road Bridge in the City of Independence</u>: Construction will continue. Traffic will be maintained across the bridge with one lane as it has since the start of the project. Expected project completion in summer of 2019.

<u>Cedar Road in the Cities of Beachwood, Lyndhurst, South Euclid and University Heights</u>: Phase 1 from Richmond Road to South Green Road will begin on March 28, 2019. Although two-way traffic will be maintained, expect delays.

<u>Warrensville Center Road in the Cities of Bedford and Maple Heights:</u> Construction is scheduled to begin on April 1, 2019. Work will begin the section between Rockside Road and I-480. Traffic will be maintained in each direction while working in this section.

<u>Bradford Pump Station Elimination in the City of Brecksville, Ohio</u>: There will be limited lane closures along Wiese, Settlers Passage, Crinkleroot during paving operations. Affected residents will be notified before closures.

Rehabilitation of Bridges 156, 157, 158 and 226 on Highland Road in the City of Euclid: Work on the bridges will continue. Traffic is being maintained in each direction. There will be no change to current traffic patterns.

<u>Bagley Road/Pleasant Valley Road in the Cities of Parma and Middleburg Heights</u>: Once weather permits, the contractor will be out to perform final items of work such as landscaping. There will be minimal impact to traffic.

<u>Pleasant Valley Road from State Road to Broadview Road</u>: Contractor will be out to install the permanent lane markings this spring when weather is dry and warm enough. There will be minimal impact to traffic.

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections conducts fair, honest and impartial elections that encourage and provide easy access for all registered voters.

The Primary Election is **May 7, 2019** and the **registration deadline** is **April 8th**. The Primary Election is in select municipalities throughout the county, therefore not everyone will be voting

in May. Check to see if your municipality has issues on the ballot. The Board of Elections website has lots of helpful information to make voting as easy as possible. On the site, you can check your registration status, locate your polling location, track your ballot and request a vote by mail ballot application. They also have filing and voter deadlines, a portal to update your voting address and a list of the issues that will be on the ballot.
