WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Second Half of Property Tax Payments

The second half of property tax payments have been mailed out to residents. These are due by **Monday, July 15**th **by 7:00 p.m.** without penalty. The funds collected from property taxes go to your local municipality and provide vital revenue to educate our local youth, to provide police and fire protection, maintain our great libraries, and support County services such as job creation and business attraction. There are currently eight options for paying property taxes, but residents are encouraged to pay by mail, online or by phone to avoid long lines.

If you are considering coming downtown to pay, please note that All-Star Week activities taking place through July 10th may affect your travel time and parking accessibility. All-Star Week

All-Star Week activities will be taking place now through July 10th. This will affect road closures and traffic. For more information, visit the <u>All-Star Information Page</u>.

<u>Towpath Trail, Stage 4 in the City of Cleveland:</u> Work on the project will begin shortly after the preconstruction meeting on July 2nd. This is the final stage. Once finished there will be a continuous, 101-mile path from Cleveland south to Akron, Massillon and New Philadelphia. Royalton Road in the City of North Royalton: Traffic will be moved onto the new pavement in early July. Work will begin on the north half of Royalton Road. Abbey Road will be closed for 30 days starting in mid-July. A detour will be posted.

<u>Cedar Road in the Cities of Beachwood, Lyndhurst, South Euclid and University Heights:</u>
Currently working on the section from Richmond Road to I-271. Within the coming month, traffic will be moved to the north half of Cedar, and work will begin on the south half. Two-way traffic will be maintained.

<u>Warrensville Center Road in the Cities of Bedford and Maple Heights:</u> The current section under construction will finish this month. Work will begin in the section from West Grace to Rockside. One-way southbound traffic will be maintained. A detour from northbound traffic will be posted.

<u>Eddy Road and Shaw Road Resurfacing in the City of Cleveland:</u> Work is scheduled to begin on Shaw Road in July. One-way traffic will be maintained for a period of 30 days.

<u>Mastick Road in Fairview Park:</u> Work is scheduled to begin the week of July 8th. Two-way traffic will be maintained for most of the time, with some portions of the project requiring traffic to be limited to one way.

Kidnapping Scam Alert

A Chagrin Falls resident recently received a terrifying call a day after she dropped her son off at an out-of-state summer camp. What sounded like her son on the other end of the line claimed he had been beaten up and taken to a warehouse. A man got on the line and said he would kill

her son unless she paid a \$10,000 ransom. This call was a scam, and the woman's son ended up being safe still at camp.

Kidnapping scams have been around for years, but there has been an increase in reports of scammers using technology to generate sounds to make calls seem more believable.
