Supporting Our Vibrant Arts & Culture Community

Arts are a key part of our community-they are crucial to our economy and they are part of the heart and soul of this county. County Executive Armond Budish announced on Friday that \$4 million in County CARES funding will be distributed to support Cuyahoga County arts organizations that have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Cuyahoga Arts and Culture will receive \$2,664,000 to distribute to arts and culture nonprofits, and Arts Cleveland will receive \$1,336,000 to provide funding to individual artists and forprofit creative businesses. This funding will provide some support for larger arts organizations in the county, but is mainly focused on supporting the small
