with shoreline stabilization efforts.



\$10 Million Investment in Cuyahoga County Economic Development

Arctaris Impact Investors and Cuyahoga County have launched the Arctaris Cuyahoga Impact Project, a \$10 million commitment to invest and lend capital in growing companies across the county located in Opportunity Zones and lowto-moderate income census tracts. This program will build community equity and inclusion while creating jobs and enhancing access to capital for growing companies. Arctaris and the County will work together to expand the program size from \$10 to \$50 million by partnering with local foundations and financial institutions. The majority of the program will support existing businesses and attract new businesses in industries such as manufacturing, industrials and healthcare.





The Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works is celebrating the completion of Mastick Road in the cities of Fairview Park and North Olmsted, a stretch of 3.2 miles of road that saw over \$6.2 million in improvements across five years.
