Mortgage Assistance Still Available

County homeowners who have been impacted by COVID-19 may be eligible for mortgage payment assistance.

County Council approved \$2 million of the County CARES Act funding received through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD)

Community Development Block Grant program to provide a one-time, zero interest deferred loan to urban County homeowners who meet HUD eligibility guidelines and who have difficulty paying their mortgages because of the financial impact of COVID-19. Assistance is available while funds last.

Resilient Power

The County is working to support highly resilient energy grids through the implementation of microgrids. Executive Budish put forth a proposal to County Council seeking approval to establish a public utility, like those of municipal utility companies, to construct microgrids throughout the County. Microgrids can generate clean energy, heating and cooling, distribute energy, manage energy consumption for big companies and enhance economic development in the region. They ensure that power is not lost when the main grid is offline.
