Triennial Update Information

All Cuyahoga County parcel owners should have received a letter from the County Fiscal Office with information on their 2021 estimated property value. Due to the current housing market, many homeowners may see an increase in their property value. This does not mean homeowners will see a comparable increase in their property taxes. The Fiscal Office encourages property owners to use the tax calculator on their website to determine their estimated 2021 property tax. The County is hosting community meetings to provide further information on the triennial update and how it's conducted. If property owners would like to challenge their property value they may do so through the Board of Revision beginning January 1, 2022.

County Seeks Partner for Creation of Child Protection Team

The Cuyahoga County Division of Children and Family Services (DCFS) is looking for a local partner to lead the creation and management of a collaborative Child Protection Team (CPT) to help prevent child abuse and neglect and catch cases that could normally slip through cracks between different systems. The County released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the project. The CPT would bring together local hospitals, social services, law enforcement, prosecutors, and the Child Advocacy Center, along with DCFS in a collaborative approach to facilitate inter-agency cooperation, real-time information exchange, and multidisciplinary case evaluation and management that improves child wellbeing and safety. Proposals are due by Friday, October 29, 2021 at 11:00 a.m.



County and DigitalC to Provide Affordable Internet in Central Neighborhood

Cuyahoga County entered into a contract with non-profit DigitalC to provide affordable, in-home, high-speed broadband services to residents in the Central neighborhood. This contract will provide for the build-out of wireless internet service infrastructure that will cover approximately 70% of the Central neighborhood and provide equipment for roughly 500 households. This work is part of a wider effort to allocate resources to the Central neighborhood through the County's Neighborhood Surge Project. This new project is designed to transform the County's underserved, most in-need communities by concentrating resources in a specific area.
