Public Service Student Loan Forgiveness

Are you a public service employee with student loan debt? If so, there's a chance you could reduce the amount you owe! For a limited time, public service employees who are repaying federal student loans can apply for a waiver that could eliminate a portion of their debt. The Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) program lets employees in public service have their federal student loan debts forgiven after 120 qualifying payments. A new, time-limited waiver lets borrowers get credit for some loan payments that didn't count toward forgiveness before. The deadline to apply is **October 31**.

The National Domestic Violence Hotline estimates that one in three women and one in four men will experience physical violence or stalking by an intimate partner at some time in their life. Locally, domestic violence is the number one call for service across many law enforcement agencies in Cuyahoga County. We all play a role in ensuring our friends and neighbors are safe and have a chance at living a life free from violence. If someone discloses abuse, talk with them about their options and encourage them to call a help line. 216-391-HELP is the local domestic violence hotline, available 24 hours a day. Cuyahoga County's Family Justice Center is open for walk-in clients Mon. - Fri. from 8:30-4:30. Call them at 216-443-**7345** and ask to speak with a victim advocate. Always call 9-1-1 during an emergency.
