County Proposes ARPA Funding to Provide Broadband Services to Residents in Least Connected Communities

As part of its long-term strategy for digital inclusion, Cuyahoga County is proposing to contract with local nonprofit PCs for People to provide in-home, high-speed internet access to roughly 25,000 Cuyahoga County residents located in the County's least connected communities. The proposed \$20 million contract would build a fixed wireless network that can support approximately 20,000 suburban households where more than 20% of the population is unconnected and the average income is below Cuyahoga County's Area Median Income.

Arctaris Cuyahoga Impact Program Celebrates First Investment in Specialized Construction Inc. in Cuyahoga Heights

Cuyahoga County, Arctaris Impact Investors, and the Cleveland Foundation recently celebrated at a special press event the acquisition of Specialized Construction Incorporated (SCI), located in Cuyahoga Heights, and owned by local African American business owner, Brian Hall. This is the first investment made by the Arctaris Cuyahoga Impact Program, a \$10 million commitment to invest equity and lend capital in growing companies across Cuyahoga County located in Opportunity Zones and low-to-moderate income census tracts, respectively.
