#### Cuyahoga County Forfeited Land Sale August 9-11, 2022

The Cuyahoga County Fiscal Office will be conducting a State of Ohio Forfeiture Land Sale from August 9th - August 11th at the Global Center for Health Innovation. The Fiscal Officer is the selling agent for the State of Ohio and maintains a list of forfeited properties seized due to nonpayment of real estate taxes. No pre-registration is required for the land sale. All purchases of real estate are "buyer beware." Buyers are strongly encouraged to contact a real estate attorney and/or title company prior to the sale.

#### Legislation Introduced to Advance Plans Toward Replacing County Jail

Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish this week presented legislation to County Council to acquire property and extend the sales tax to facilitate plans to replace the 46-year-old County Corrections Center. "Based upon in-depth studies and investigations, it is clear that our current jail is outdated. A new jail will be more safe, efficient, and effective both for the prisoners and the corrections personnel," stated Budish. The legislation will go through multiple Council and Committee meetings before a vote is held.
