CUYAHOGA COUNTY COURT ORDER TITLE INFORMATION PACKET

(Ohio Revised Code 4505.10)

** Please recognize that there is no guarantee that a court order directing issuance of a motor vehicle certificate of title will be granted. The decision depends on the Court finding that you have presented sufficient evidence to establish your claim that you are entitled to the possession and ownership of the subject motor vehicle. **

In Cuyahoga County the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Office, Auto Title Division, has principal responsibility for issuing motor vehicle certificates of title on behalf of, and in cooperation with, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, Ohio Department of Public Safety (BMV). A properly issued motor vehicle certificate of title is the primary evidence of ownership of the motor vehicle described in the certificate.

In a limited number of circumstances, a judge of the Common Please Court can order the Auto Title Division to issue you a motor vehicle certificate of title. These circumstances include:

- I. Lost or stolen title with no historical records: When the original certificate of title issued by the State of Ohio or any other state has been lost, destroyed or stolen and a duplicate of that certificate as provided by Section 4505.12 of the Ohio Revised Code is not available from the Clerk or BMV due to lack of historical title records.
- II. **Incomplete sale:** When you have purchased a vehicle, but the previous owner has failed, refused or otherwise been unable to furnish you with a properly assigned certificate of title
- III. **Abandoned:** When you have been given a vehicle or it has been left in your possession and ownership, but the previous owner has failed, refused or otherwise been able to complete the transaction by supplying required documents.
- IV. Repair garage, storage facility or towing company:
 - a. When you are the owner of a repair garage or storage facility who is in possession of a vehicle valued at **more** than \$3,500.00 after deduction of repairs to restore the vehicle to wholesale value. The vehicle has to have been unclaimed by the owner for more than fifteen days after notice to reclaim the vehicle.
 - b. When the repair garage, storage facility or towing company does not have documents necessary to file an Unclaimed Motor Vehicle Affidavit. If uncertain if this applies, please request the information for an Unclaimed Motor Vehicle Affidavit.

The Ohio Revised Code sets forth specific procedures to follow in instances other that the four listed above. Here are some examples of circumstances when Section 4505.10 of the Ohio Revised Code does **not** apply:

I. When you are the owner of a repair garage or storage facility in possession of a vehicle valued **less** than \$3,500.00 after deduction of repairs, where the vehicle has remained unclaimed by the

- owner for more than fifteen days after notice to reclaim the vehicle (ORC 4505.101)
- II. When you are the operator of a manufactured home park attempting to remove a tenant's manufactured home from the park property (ORC 3733.091 and 1923.12)
- III. When you are the pawnbroker seeking forfeiture and title to a motor vehicle that has not been redeemed by the owner after expiration or breach of the loan secured by that motor vehicle (ORC 4505.102)
- IV. When a motor vehicle, whether a "junk motor vehicle" or not, has been abandoned on private property owned by you; and you do not want tile to the motor vehicle, but rather simply want it moved or disposed of (ORC 4513.60 through 4513.65, inclusive)

INSTRUCTIONS FOR OBTAINING A COURT ORDERED MOTOR VEHCILE CERTIFICATE OF TITILE

This guide for obtaining a court ordered title has been compiled for purposes of example only. It is only intended to provide a summary and should not be regarded as a complete digest of laws affecting motor vehicle titles, nor should it be regarded as legally binding on the County of Cuyahoga, the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer, or the Cuyahoga County Clerk of Courts, none of whom are authorized to provide legal advice to petitioners. Instead, petitioners are encouraged to consult with private legal counsel.

If you believe that Section 4505.10 of the Ohio Revised Code does apply to your situation, there are certain steps you will need to take before the court can consider your petition for an Order directing the title division to issue a motor vehicle certificate of title to you. Please keep in mind that incomplete/inaccurate paperwork may cause your case to be dismissed. The recommended steps are outlined within.

You should attach the following documents to your Affidavit as exhibits:

- Copies of the record search report (BMV 2433) you obtained from the BMV
- State Highway Patrol Inspection form (HP 106/HP106F)
- Correspondence and certified mail receipts showing you have tried to contact the current owner and lien holder (if applicable) in an attempt to secure a properly assigned certificate of title.
- Copies of any additional documentation or evidence you believe necessary to support your claim, including, for example:
 - Any receipt, bill of sale, or cancelled check as evidence of your performance as purchaser in connection with an incomplete transaction that was not the result of your own failure to perform.
 - Sworn statements of other persons familiar with the circumstances surrounding your possession of the vehicle.

Step Two: Vehicle Owner Record Search	(614) 752-7671 www.bmv.ohio.gov Ohio BMV Attn: BMV Records PO Box 16520 Columbus, OH 43216-6520	 Complete BMV 1173 Form and check the box "Last Known Address" and "Copy of Record" for the vehicle owner and remit the form to the BMV using the instructions provided on the form. The BMV will mail a BMV 2433 form to you containing the results of the record search. BMV 1173 forms are available online at www.bmv.ohio.gov or by calling (614) 752-7671 A \$5.00 record search fee will apply for each title record search. Please allow at least 15 business days for processing. Please retain BMV 2433 form to file with your petition as a necessary exhibit.
Step Three: Certified Mail Notifications	www.usps.gov	 Mail a certified letter to the vehicle owner(s) and lien holder(s) using information provided by the BMV and Auto Title Division notifying them of your intention to petition the Court for Certificate of Title. Please retain copies of the letters mailed as well as the returned certified mail receipts to file with your petition as a necessary exhibit. Please allow 30 days from the date of mailing for appropriate parties to respond.
Step Four: Obtain OSHP Inspection Receipt	Deputy Registrar Office (614) 752-7671 www.bmv.ohio.gov	 Visit your local deputy registrar office to purchase an OSHP Inspection Receipt (HP105) The cost for the OSHP Inspection Receipt is \$53.50. Visit www.bmv.ohio.gov or call (614) 752-7671 for your nearest deputy registrar location.

Step Five: OSHP Inspection


- To schedule your OSHP Inspection contact the Ohio State Highway Patrol at (614) 644-1667.
- Be sure to inform OSHP that you need to obtain an HP106 form for a court ordered title.
- Bring your vehicle, inspection receipt (HP105) and any supporting documentation of ownership/possession to the inspection station on the day of your inspection. A VIN check will be performed by OSHP to determine whether the vehicle was stolen and/or if any brandings exist on the vehicle.
- Please retain the HP106 form you are provided by the OSHP. This document will be required as necessary evidence in your petition to the court.

Step Six: Filing Your Petition to the Court of Common Pleas

- Bring your original Petition for Court Order, Affidavit in Support of the Petition, and your evidence, to be filed as a miscellaneous case.
- Add all possible interested parties who may have a claim to the title, such as any title holders and lien holders that you identified through your BMV Vehicle Owner Record Search (BMV 2433) and your OSHP Inspection (106).
- If a lien was identified on the vehicle, please inform the clerk so the lien can be properly addressed in the petition and judgment entry.
- If the vehicle is an unrecovered, stolen vehicle, the proposed Court order must state that the BMV is instructed to lift all holds on the title long enough to transfer the title to the petitioner.
- A filing fee of \$250.00 will need to be paid at the time of filing your petition.



Additional Documentation and Reference Material

Attached you will find the forms and reference materials needed to complete the steps of the court ordered title process. These forms as well as supporting evidence will need to be submitted with the Petition for Court Order to Issue Certificate of Title. The required petition must be filed within 60 days of the vehicle inspection.
