In accordance with County Code §701.07(C), we are submitting this monthly update through April 2020.

• General Fund Revenue:

Sales Tax receipts totaled \$20.6 million in April 2020. Through April, sales tax receipts totaled \$93.3 million, which represents a year over year increase of 6.33%.

• Health & Human Services Levy generated from the County's two voted levies for health and human services is budgeted to be \$244,158,184: \$223.1 million in property taxes and \$15.8 million from the State (homestead credit).

- Attached is the new INFOR/Lawson report YEAR-TO-DATE FUND BALANCE by FUND, which summarizes YTD Receipts and YTD Expenditures for all of the County's funds. Please note:
 - This YEAR-TO-DATE FUND BALANCE by FUND has not been audited
 - Several funds have been consolidated (ie: Casino Fund, Auto Title, Coroner's Lab, County Planning Commission have been consolidated to General Fund)
 - Subfunds have been eliminated
- **Bond Refunding,** on April 30, 2020 we issued \$28,105,000 of Economic Development Revenue Refunding Bonds in three different series to refund \$32,285,000 of bonds issued in 2010. We were successful in attracting ten different investors for the three series of bonds. The savings from this transaction will total more than \$9.3 million over the life of the issue. Present value savings from the refunding is 11.12% or \$240,000 higher than what was present to the Finance & Budget Committee on December 9, 2019.
- Opioid Settlement Funds, on April 14,2020, we received a settlement from TEVA
 Pharmaceutical in the amount of \$858,913.34 which brings our total cash balance to \$117,589,608.89 in Opioid Mitigation Funds.
- CARES Act, on April 24, 2020, we received \$215,510,539.80 in CARES Act funding for COVID-19 expenses. As of May 8, 2020, we have obligated \$10,532,744.32 for Emergency COVID-19 related expenses.
- Anticipated Budget Reductions due to COVID-19. We continue to project 20% loss of sales tax revenue and 10% loss in property and other tax revenue for 2020. These percentages translate to approximately \$76M in lost revenue (\$53M in sales tax, \$23M in property and other taxes). As a result, we are planning to reduce expenditures by implementing a hiring freeze, 10-day furloughs and 15% budget reductions for County Executive departments. We are also working with the Non-Executive departments to implement similar measures and budget reductions.
