In accordance with County Code §701.07(C), we are submitting this monthly update through March 2020.

Again, we are live with the new INFOR/Lawson system. We are all still learning and getting
acclimated to the new system. The following bullets contain some preliminary information
through March 2020.

General Fund Revenue:

Sales Tax receipts totaled \$26.6 million in March 2020. Through March, sales tax receipts totaled \$72.6 million, which represents a year over year increase of 5.98%.

 Health & Human Services Levy generated from the County's two voted levies for health and human services is budgeted to be \$244,158,184: \$223.1 million in property taxes and \$15.8 million from the State (homestead credit).

- Attached is the new INFOR/Lawson report YEAR-TO-DATE FUND BALANCE by FUND, which summarizes YTD Receipts and YTD Expenditures for all of the County's funds. Please note:
 - o This YEAR-TO-DATE FUND BALANCE by FUND has not been audited
 - Several funds have been consolidated (ie: Casino Fund, Auto Title, Coroner's Lab, County Planning Commission have been consolidated to General Fund)
 - Subfunds have been eliminated
- Bond Ratings to refinance series 2010A (Brownfield Redevelopment Fund Project), series 2010B (Commercial Redevelopment Fund Project) and series 2010C (Gateway Arena Project) bonds. As you know, last month we received a rating AA/Stable from S&P Global and a rating of Aa2 from Moody's Investor Services. On April 14, 2020, we provided both rating agencies with a statement regarding the County's Declaration of Fiscal Emergency and additional financial disclosure due to COVID-19. We anticipate refunding these bonds in the next two weeks.
- Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP), an additional \$7,873,799 has been appropriated to complete Phase 1 (scheduled to be complete by August 31, 2020). This includes capitalized personnel costs estimated at \$\$1,217,960, contracts of \$6,394,839 and hardware costs of \$261,000.
- **COVID-19,** Pursuant to an emergency declaration through Executive Order EO2020-0002, an additional \$5,000,000 has been appropriated for mission-critical purchases for items needed to prevent and respond to COVID-19. County Code 501.08 Emergency Contracting authorizes an expedited procurement process for purchases.
- Anticipated Budget Reductions due to COVID-19. We are projecting 20% loss of sales tax revenue and 10% loss in property and other tax revenue for 2020. These percentages translate to approximately \$76M in lost revenue (\$53M in sales tax, \$23M in property and other taxes). As a result, we are planning to reduce expenditures by implementing a hiring freeze, 10-day furloughs and 15% budget reductions for County Executive departments. We are also working with the Non-Executive departments to implement similar measures and budget reductions.
