In accordance with County Code §701.07(C), the following is the monthly update for April 2022.

**Gross Sales Tax** receipts (before allocation to General Fund and Debt Service) totaled \$23.1 million in the month of April 2022. Year-to-date, sales tax receipts totaled \$103.8 million, which represents a year over year increase of 12.1%.

## • General Fund:

The most significant source of revenue is Sales Taxes. The Sales taxes allocated to the General Fund totaled \$100.2 million. The following tables summarize General Fund revenues, expenditures and subsidies:

- In April, Council approved additional **appropriations of \$1 million for Veterans Services Commission** to support the purchase of a new building located at East 40<sup>th</sup> and Chester Avenue.
- In April, Council approved additional appropriations of \$2,759,430 for the Community Development Supplemental Grant Program, approved by Ordinance O2020-0001. This appropriation will fund \$982,745 in remaining 2021 grants and \$1,776,685 in new 2022 grants to various municipalities and agencies for various projects and programs.
- The Alternative Tax Budget for 2023 has been submitted to County Council. This budget is required by Oho Revised Code and demonstrates our need for property taxes levied by Cuyahoga County. This budget includes:
  - o Schedule 1 detailing our levies and the allocation of inside millage
  - Schedule 2 estimating our resources
  - Schedule 3 detailing our general obligation debt
