In accordance with **County Code §701.07(C)**, the following is the monthly update for **October 2022**.

Gross Sales Tax receipts (before allocation to General Fund and Debt Service) totaled \$25.7 million in the month of October 2022. Year-to-date sales tax receipts totaled \$261.8 million, which represents a year over year increase of 5.4%.

• General Fund:

The most significant source of revenue is Sales Taxes. Year-to-date Sales Taxes allocated to the General Fund total \$258.3 million. The following tables summarize General Fund revenues, expenditures and subsidies:

 - YTD Receipts
 - o YTD Expenditures
 - Ending Cash Balance
- Significant Changes:
 - The County **issued \$30,600,000 in Series 2022A Economic Development Revenue Bonds** for renovations at the Convention Center.
 - Council approved the Fiscal Officer's Estimate of Tax Rates to be Levied for 2023. The estimate allocates 1.45 mills of inside millage: General Fund (1.10 mills) and General Fund for Bond Retirement (0.35 mills). The estimate also allocates 16.90 mills of outside millage as follows: Health & Human Services (4.8 and 4.70 mills), BODD (3.9 mills) and County Library (3.5 mills).
 - Council approved additional appropriations of \$2,738,000 for the Department of Information Technology for items not included in the 2022 budget. Approved Items included additional security (Incident Responses, Engineering (Microsoft & Zoom

licenses), Applications (payments to contractors for unfilled positions) and Communications (AT&T to support remote work).

 Council approved additional appropriations of \$3,300,000 for the Department of Health & Human Services – Division of Children & Family Services for the Say Yes to Education program. This appropriation represents the Cleveland Metropolitan School District's portion of Year 4 which will be fully reimbursed to the County.
