In accordance with **County Code §701.07(C)**, the following is the monthly update for **September 2022**.

**Gross Sales Tax** receipts (before allocation to General Fund and Debt Service) totaled \$26 million in the month of September 2022. Year-to-date sales tax receipts totaled \$236 million, which represents a year over year increase of 6.6%.

## • General Fund:

The most significant source of revenue is Sales Taxes. Year-to-date Sales Taxes allocated to the General Fund total \$229.8 million. The following tables summarize General Fund revenues, expenditures and subsidies:

- Significant Changes:
  - In anticipation of issuing Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2022A for renovations at the Convention Center, we held bond rating calls with both S&P Global and Moody's Investor Services. These bond rating calls resulted in ratings of AA/Stable from S&P Global and Aa2 stable from Moody's Investor Services on the Series 2022A Economic Development Revenue Bonds. Both reports highlighted the County's "healthy financial position supported by strong fiscal management."
  - Council approved additional appropriations of \$1,146,230 for the Board of Elections to purchase ancillary voting equipment to support the implementation of new voting equipment. The Ohio Secretary of State funded the purchase of the new voting equipment.

- Council approved **additional appropriations of \$2,815,521 for the Medical Examiner** for additional staff, collective bargaining and non-bargaining pay increases, body transportation, computer and equipment upgrades and additional medical lab supplies.
- On September 12, 2022, the County received a grant in the amount of \$9,700,000 from the Ohio Department of Development, Office of BroadbandOhio to bring high speed internet access to every Ohioan and build a best-in-class broadband network in Ohio.
