In accordance with County Code §701.07(C), the following is the monthly update for July 2023.

Gross Sales Tax receipts (before allocation to General Fund and Debt Service) totaled \$25.4 million in the month of July 2022. Year-to-date sales tax receipts totaled \$188.6 million, which represents a year over year increase of 3.3%.

• General Fund:

The most significant source of revenue is Sales Taxes. Year-to-date Sales Taxes allocated to the General Fund total \$183.6 million. The following tables summarize General Fund revenues, expenditures and subsidies:

• Significant Changes:

- Council approved additional appropriations totaling \$205,179.49 for Public Defender parity increases. These parity increase impacted attorney and non-attorney staff effective May 8, 2023.
- Council approved additional appropriations totaling \$5,150,000 for Economic Development loan disbursements that will be issued from January 1, 2023 to December, 31, 2023.
- Council approved capital appropriations totaling \$1,650,000 for the Department of Information Technology. These capital funds will be used for basic infrastructure maintenance including replacement of wireless access points, obsolete desk phones, network monitoring systems, recording equipment and the re-implementation of managed detection and response security.
- Council approved a budgeted cash transfer totaling \$21,731,830 for the 1st half subsidy from the Health & Human Services 4.8 and 4.7 mills levies to Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS).
- Council approved additional appropriations and cash transfers totaling \$8,118,000 for the third quarter (July-September) Health & Human Services Levy subsidy transfers to MetroHealth.

- Council approved additional appropriations totaling \$2,400,000 for the Child Wellness Campus to provide services to children in County custody. The Department of Health & Human Services received \$1,200,000 from the Board of Developmental Disabilities and \$1,200,000 from Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) to support this Wellness Campus.
- Council approved additional appropriations totaling \$5,532,000 for increased jail medical services provided by Metrohealth and outside medical providers. These appropriations were necessary to cover 2022 payments (for the months of November and December paid in 2023) as well as rising costs of outside medical care.
- Council approved re-appropriation of \$1,096,974.05 for the Board of Elections. These appropriations were originally approved (but not spent) in 2022 for the purchase and implementation of equipment approved in 2022 for the new voting equipment project.
