CURRENT PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY –

Fatal Cases due to heroin/fentanyl/analogs in July- at least 48 (10 cases pending testing)

31 - City of Cleveland Residents

16 - Suburban Residents- Berea, Broadview Hts., Chagrin Falls, Cleveland Hts., East Cleveland (4), Euclid (2), Garfield Hts., Lakewood, Parma, Parma Hts., Strongsville and Westlake

VICTIMS

Victims' ages range from under 1 - 70

35 Male victims; 12 Female victims; 1 unidentified

16 African American victims; 31 Caucasian victims; 1 unknown (2 Hispanic victims)

TRENDS


At least **324** victims have died from heroin/fentanyl/analog or in combination through July 2023. 2023 total is at least **406** fatalities when including cocaine as well.

<u>Carfentanil: 191 cases in 2017; 24 cases in 2018; 220 in 2019; 63 confirmed in 2020; 6 confirmed in 2021; 1 confirmed in 2022; 0 in 2023</u>

Rate of African American deaths involving fentanyl is 33% of all victims in July 2023 and over 35% for the year. As many as 48 cocaine related deaths occurred in July 2023 with as many as 33 being mixed with Fentanyl, Heroin or both.
