CURRENT PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY –

Fatal Cases due to heroin/fentanyl/analogs in June- at least 47 (10 cases pending testing)

31 - City of Cleveland Residents

16 - Suburban Residents- Berea, Broadview Hts., Chagrin Falls, Cleveland Hts., East Cleveland (4), Euclid (2), Garfield Hts., Lakewood, Parma, Parma Hts., Strongsville and Westlake

VICTIMS

Victims' ages range from under 1 - 74

36 Male victims; 13 Female victims; 1 unidentified

19 African American victims; 31 Caucasian victims (6 Hispanic victims)

TRENDS

At least **276** victims have died from heroin/fentanyl/analog or in combination through June 2023. 2023 total is at least **343** fatalities when including cocaine as well.

<u>Carfentanil: 191 cases in 2017; 24 cases in 2018; 220 in 2019; 63 confirmed in 2020; 6 confirmed in 2021; 1 confirmed in 2022</u>

Rate of African American deaths involving fentanyl is 36% of all victims in June 2023 and over 38% for the year. As many as 46 cocaine related deaths occurred in June 2023 with as many as 33 being mixed with Fentanyl, Heroin or both.

Victims' ages range from under 1 - 71

26 Male victims; 16 Female victims

18 African American victims; 24 Caucasian victims (3 Hispanic victims)

TRENDS

At least **229** victims have died from heroin/fentanyl/analog or in combination through May 2023. 2023 total is at least **283** fatalities when including cocaine as well.

<u>Carfentanil: 191 cases in 2017; 24 cases in 2018; 220 in 2019; 63 confirmed in 2020; 6 confirmed in 2021; 1 confirmed in 2022</u>

Rate of African American deaths involving fentanyl is 43% of all victims in May 2023 and over 40% for the year. As many as 47 cocaine related deaths occurred in May 2023 with as many as 33 being mixed with Fentanyl, Heroin or both.


TRENDS


At least **179** victims have died from heroin/fentanyl/analog or in combination through April 2023. 2023 total is at least **222** fatalities when including cocaine as well.

<u>Carfentanil: 191 cases in 2017; 24 cases in 2018; 220 in 2019; 63 confirmed in 2020; 6 confirmed in 2021; 1 confirmed in 2022</u>

Rate of African American deaths involving fentanyl is 42% of all victims in April 2023 and over 40% for the year. As many as 28 cocaine related deaths occurred in April 2023 with as many as 24 being mixed with Fentanyl, Heroin or both.











2023 CCMEO Overdose Deaths, Most Common Drugs Involved *(thru June 30, 2023)
