CURRENT PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY –

Fatal Cases due to heroin/fentanyl/analogs in September – at least 36 (12 cases pending testing)

- 20 City of Cleveland Residents
- 12 Suburban Residents- Bedford, Brook Park, Cleveland Hts., Euclid Lakewood, North Olmsted, North Royalton (2), Parma, Parma Hts., and Warrensville (2)
- 2 Out of County Elyria (Lorain Co.), Copley (Portage Co.)
- 2 Unknown

VICTIMS

Victims' ages range from under 23 - 68

25 Male victims; 11 Female victims

10 African American victims; 26 Caucasian victims; (1 Hispanic victim)


TRENDS

At least **370** victims have died from heroin/fentanyl/analog or in combination through September 2023. 2023 total is at least **487** fatalities when including cocaine as well.

<u>Carfentanil: 191 cases in 2017; 24 cases in 2018; 220 in 2019; 63 confirmed in 2020; 6 confirmed in 2021; 1 confirmed in 2022; 0 in 2023</u>

Rate of African American deaths involving fentanyl is 27.78% of all victims in September 2023 and over 35% for the year. As many as 47 cocaine related deaths occurred in September 2023 with as many as 23 being mixed with Fentanyl, Heroin or both.
