- Reduces carbon footprint by substituting plastic bags with durable and long-lasting reusable bags and paper bags made from recycled materials.
- **Cleaner water supply** by reducing the amount of microplastics that leach in from plastic bags.
- More efficient public utility operations. Water and sewer systems run more smoothly without plastic bags clogging storm drains and other equipment.
- Cleaner neighborhoods. Plastic bags (also known as urban tumbleweeds) are often seen littering our yards, roadways, trees and playgrounds.
- **Cost savings** because the costs of "free" single-use bags are passed on to consumers at checkout and to taxpayers who pay for litter clean-up.

REMEMBER TO BRING YOUR BAGS

Change can be a challenge, but try to remember to keep reusable bags in your car and grab them before you go into a store. Reusable bags have many upsides because they:

- · Don't rip as easily.
- · Hold more per bag.
- Save you money when retailers aren't passing on the costs of their bags to you.
